Waiver Information – Please Read

Instructional Schedule Waiver

Original Waiver: PBHS will continue to alter the student and teacher calendar by offering a 4-day school week with a fifth day reserved for enrichment activities. The Enrichment Friday schedule will allow students one day to pursue individual learning, interface with the community, and acquire real-world experiences.

Add to Year 2018-2019

Young Scholar Academy (YSA) program continues for the 2018-2019 school year. YSA is offered one Friday per quarter for three school quarters. Staff and students benefit from the program that offers enrichment activities to students from schools across the district. PBHS teachers and students serve as instructors and counselors.

CANVAS Trainings continue to take place on Fridays. Teachers engaged in this district initiative which was fully implemented in the 2018-2019 school year. Teachers attend district trainings, work in PLC's, and work individually to build class based websites for their various curricula, employing student input in the step by step process.

PBHS hosts students and adults from across the world to share in smaller and larger visits including FLYE (Foreign Language Youth Program). PBHS hosts the 2019 International Summit with over 150 administrators, teachers and students from around the world collaborate. Students and faculty team continue to plan, organize, and implement events bringing global awareness and curricula to our school and the district.

Other Friday activities include AP/EOC tutoring; State trainings such as Humanities Council and TDIF local, state, and national conventions and conferences including National Council of Teachers of English, Sanibel Writers Conference, Society for Science, and National Science Teachers Association Conference; District, state, and national student conventions and workshops including SECME, Sea Perch, TRAC, ACS, AMTA, Green Team gardening, FLINN Safety for Science, Florida State Astronaut Competition, History Day, the FEA Convention, FSPA, Debate tournaments, Thespians, Student Government Association meetings and conferences, and Honor Society district conferences as well as Chinese Awareness Day. Students and faculty rehearse for plays and talent shows; teachers attend College Board trainings, teachers work on National Board Renewals, and students and teachers take part in online trainings and courses as well as dual enrollment and master's degree courses, Think Tank, Yearbook, Newspaper, Newsela, Naviance, and Drama production meetings, JROTC community support, and Music, Band, Orchestra, and Chorus rehearsals.

Professional Study Day

Original Waiver: The District shall provide that students at PBHS shall be dismissed three hours early for the purpose of High School Reform (PBHS will continue to waive out of regularly scheduled Early Release Days per a previously mentioned waiver). The goal of this waiver is to (1) increase the academic achievement levels of high school students, (2) increase the percent of high school graduates, (3) increase the percent of graduates who begin their postsecondary path to college or career while in a Florida high school, and (4) change the culture.

Department Chairs suggested voting in four (4) days as per previous years. District select days as follow:

Add to year 2018-2019

The goal of the waiver is to increase learning gains for all students especially our lowest quartile. As a we continue to increase performance, we continue to enrich our programs based on the rigor of the school across the curriculum for all students. Strategies for maintaining the increase include the implementation of updated and considerably more technology within a variety of subject areas including use of BASIS and Naviance, the enhancement and continuation of PASL and mentoring techniques, and the updating of communication through programs such as CANVAS. Departments utilize the PSD days to focus on specific curricula goals based on standards, to implement new strategies for utilizing technology within the curricula, and to share best practices with peers. Students are also taking part in Dual Enrollment courses both on and off campus to continue to update their knowledge, to increase rigor, and to prepare for college courses. Teachers are being trained to implement Pre-AP curriculum in English and Algebra I in the fall.

Early Release Day

Original Waiver: This waiver will allow teachers to focus on implementing strategies to meet math, reading, writing, and technology goals for the full school day when the rest of the district has early release during district early release days. Staff development will be scheduled as needed, which will allow for more intense focus on student achievement, team building, database development, and prescriptive staff and student development. If PBHS participated in early release days, our periods would need to be longer than the current 62 minutes. In lieu of early release, staff will participate in after-school or Friday professional development activities, including in-service workshops and college courses, our Quality Improvement Team (QIT or Professional Learning Community, PLC), National Board Certification. Since more time will be spent

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with students and focusing on school improvement objectives, this waiver will support the school's improvement objectives.

PBHS has sustained FSA scores at the top of the county and PBHS ranked highly in both the state and the nation. PBHS continues as an "A" school. Staff offers after school tutoring in all subject areas as well as tutoring and/or professional development on Fridays. Teachers also attend PLC's and QIT's to better prepare instruction and to ensure a safe and healthy environment for students. Employment of technology continues to grow with utilization of such programs as Khan Academy, Albert.IO, No Red Ink, USA Test Prep, Newsela, and Canvas.




