School Compact

Review of the School and Parent Engagement Plan

Review of Annual Evaluation Survey

SMART Bond Money

The SMART Bond votes were presented to the SAC community. Votes comprised of parents, teachers, community members. The results were 148 votes for option 2 and 91 votes for option 1. The information will be given to the county officials. Option 2 items were marquee, blinds, custodial equipment, playground upgrades, and school furniture.

Parent Allocation of funds

Parents and staff discussed what will be purchased with Title 1 funds for next year and parents suggested to purchase school agendas, as well as continue daytime events community events. This was 100% agreed upon by parents and staff.
