#### I. Welcome 5:25

Mr. Forbes calls the meeting to order and welcomes Dr. LaCasse to present the Principal's Report.

#### II. Principal's Report 5:26

Dr. LaCasse begins by speaking to the construction that is set to begin in March.

- A. The Single Point of Entry is expected to be finished sometime in May. Construction crews have already begun setting up a staging area in the front parking lot of the school.
- B. Nova High School has employed somebody to watch security cameras fulltime. Nova is currently in the process of replacing the old security cameras with new ones.
- C. The month of March marks the beginning of testing season, starting on March 6th, where all Juniors will take the SAT.
- D. Nova High School is currently looking to hire more teachers following the promotion and retirement of several current faculty members.
- E. Graduation will be on May 31st in the morning at NSU. Each student will be allotted 6 tickets but are not allowed to sell unused tickets to their peers.

#### III. Adopt January Meeting Minutes 5:28

- A. Mr. Forbes asks SAC to review January's meeting minutes and calls for a motion to approve.
- B. A motion is made by Mr. Laverde to approve and is seconded by Mr. Thompson. Motion passes.

#### IV. Equity Report 5:30

Ms. Atkinson, Nova's Equity Liaison, begins by defining equity as providing resources and support to disadvantaged students so that they can succeed. Her role includes implementing and overseeing initiatives that help create a more equitable school culture and climate.

- A. Nova High School experiences an overrepresentation of certain ethnic groups when administering disciplinary action.
- B. The Summer reading books for this year included Chicano literature so that it is more relatable to Latin American students.
- C. There is a school-wide effort to build public speaking skills events such as Speech and Elocution Competitions, as well as initiatives to incorporate student culture such as Dominos Night. The school also participated in an "Empowering Voices" initiative in which door decorations and murals of social justice warriors

served to instill a sense of pride amongst minority students.

#### V. School Improvement Plan 5:42

- A. Ms. Sexton mentions that at every SAC meeting, we must discuss the School Improvement Plan. Every school is required to develop a SIP plan for their school which develops and promotes improvements within a school. She introduces Mr. Roy to present information about the science department.
- B. Mr. Roy notes that there has been a decrease in biology proficiency in recent years, due to the fact that more and more students take the class in middle school and not in high school.
  - a. 50% of students tested proficient in Biology as per the mock EOC in December.
  - b. Teachers are working to incorporate more labs to help the kinesthetic learners.
  - c. The Biology EOC has been moved to May which means there is more time to review.

#### VI. Create Nominating Committee for SAC Leadership Roles 5:52

- A. Ms. Sexton mentions that at a training for improving SAC committees in Broward she learned that schools ought to have a committee for recommending members to serve leadership positions within SAC. Mr. Judd, Ms. Debacher, Mr. Forbes and Ms. White volunteer to serve on this committee next year.
- B. Mr. Forbes asks for a motion passes to approve the nominating committee.
- C. Ms. Siff motions to approve the committee. Mr. Laverde seconds. Motions passes.

#### VII. Stakeholder School Improvement Plan Survey 5:56

A. Ms. Sexton instructs the SAC to complete a stakeholder survey online using laptops provided.
