Meeting Call to Order at 6:08PM/ Roll Call (Determination of a Quorum)

- I. **Welcome:** was made by Mr. Daniel Calleja/Co-SAC Chair
- II. **New Members approvals:** Ms. Ollies-Director of Guidance was officially approved by the SAC Committee. Ms. Johnson: ESE Representative was also approved with one opposed.
- III. **Approval of the September Minutes:** Minutes were approved with one correction. (Add \$5000.00 to the Accountability Funds for the afterschool tutoring.)
- IV. **Principal Report:** Dr. Jason Nault, Principal 2017-2018 Data
 - Stated that he has accepted another position out of state in Northern Illinois. His last day will be 10/18.2018.
 - Gave the State of the School Address, which covered the enrollment of students
 - Break down of all groups of students-blacks, whites, & Hispanics
 - Break down of the school's grade and the areas that were used to determine the overall score
 - Ten components for high school, four that are directly related to student achievement (English, math, science, social studies) the total score is 1000.
 - Four components related to learning gains. (Two in English and math and two for the lowest 25%, the graduation rate and the acceleration rate.
 - Break down was given for all the courses that Taravella offer (CTE courses are really being pushed to give students serval opportunities to earn certificates in multiple courses.)
 - Taravella made a C grade with an overall score of 522 out of 1000.
- V. **School Improvement Plan:** Mrs. Anita Natale/Assistant Principal
 - Components of the plan were given consisting of:
 - Attendance
 - Behavior
 - RtI/MTSS (Response to Intervention)
 - School counseling
 - FACE (Family and Community Engagement)
 - SEL (Social Emotional Learning)
 - There were also 8 goal gives as part of the SIP Plan
 - What is the SIP? 2 areas of focus (algebra and English Language Arts (ELA)
 - Accountable Talk –is a big push
 - Listening to one another

VI. **Accountability Funds: Request for Funds**

- Write Score Software Presentation:** Mrs. Jennifer Bard & Ms. Debra Johnson
- Purpose of Request:** data driven classroom instruction tool aligns to state standards, allowing teachers to determine the areas where their students' need additional help, and helps teachers provide differentiated instruction to optimize student growth.
- SAC Objective that is addressed:** The Write Score supports SIP objective # 4: Scaling up best practices by focusing on continuous improvement based the continuous improvement model.
- Number of students impacted:** 812 with licenses for writing assessment, an additional 762 through teacher resources and lessons.
- Rationale for Request:** by providing teachers with the Write Score software, students will gain personalized writing instruction and thus show improvement in achievement scores on the Florida Standards Assessments (FSA). Students will also along with their teachers support be able to focus on the areas of weakness in writing by utilizing writing and reading samples similar to those they will encounter on the FSA.
- Itemized Amount Requested:** \$7,498.01

- October 10th, 80 different colleges and universities and financial aid workshop was in the auditorium

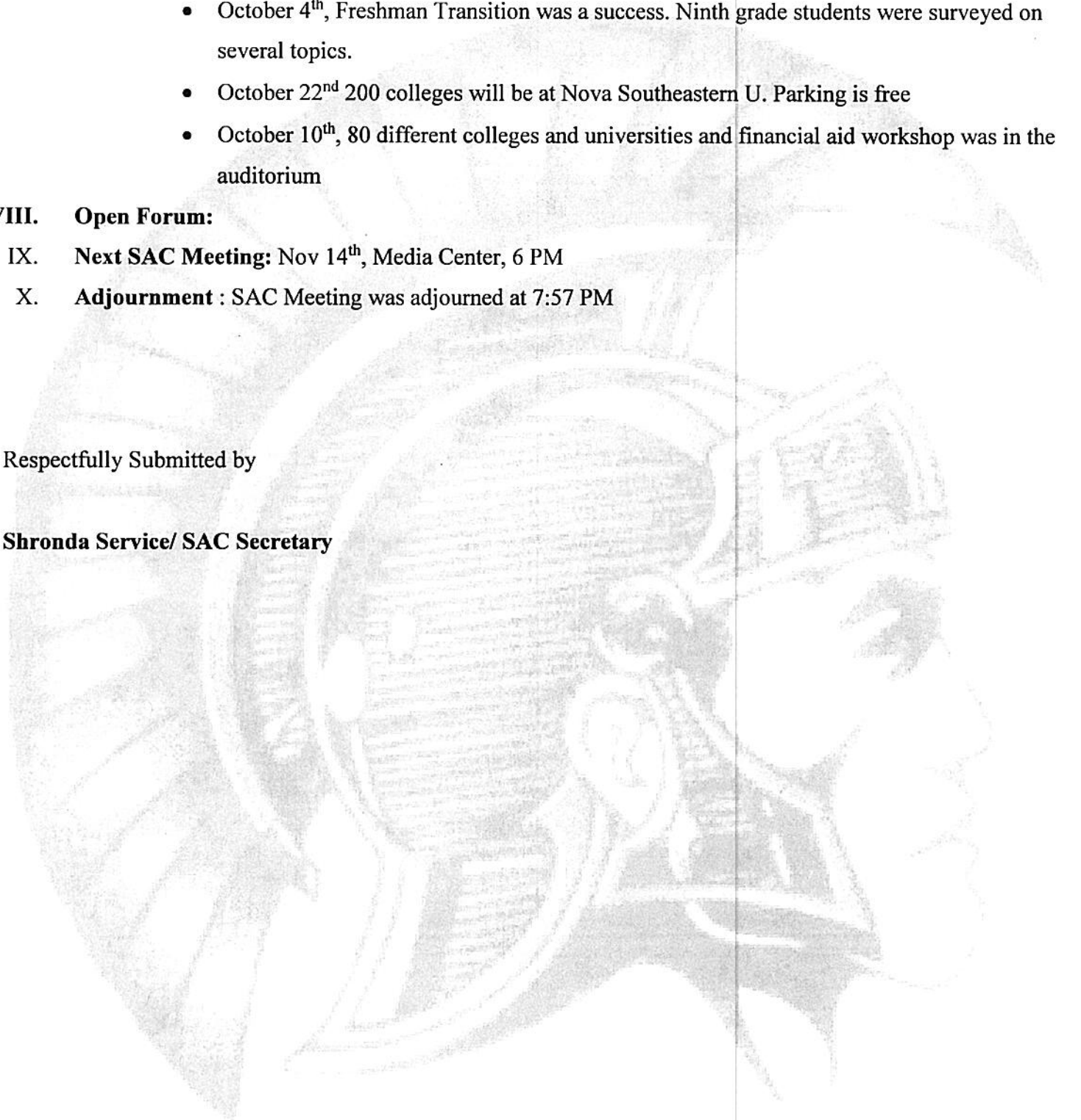

NEW WAIVER INTENT TO APPLY FORM

School: JP Taravella High School Principal: Mrs. Mary De Armas Date: 11/14/18

Cadre Director: Michael Ramirez SAC Chair(s): Dan Calleja

- **Policy or contract article to be waived:**

As per School Board Policy 6000.1, a student may be exempt from the midterm and/or final exams in a high school course under the following criteria:

(1) The student earns a grade of "B" or better in all marking periods of the respective high school course during the semester of the exemption.

(2) The student may waive eligible midterms or final exams for up to one-half all high school or higher level courses on the student's regular school day schedule.


(5) The statewide, standardized EOC assessments, required by statute, are not eligible for exemption; however the student may exempt the midterm exam. (6) Midterm and/or final exams cannot be retroactively exempted once the student takes the exam

- **Brief description of waiver request:**

JP Taravella High School will waive EOC course midterms from the list of midterms that students may be eligible for exemption.

- **Rationale for Waiver Request:**


Courses culminating in high stakes testing such as End of Course exams (EOCs) should require all students to take the course midterm examination. The midterm examination provides teachers with standards based formative data that allows students to plan targeted remediation for students to support student mastery of content area standards for the actual EOC exam. In addition, the midterm exam is the closest simulated test to the EOC that students will have an opportunity to take as the testing window and cumulative nature of the midterm exam is directly aligned to the actual EOC. The experience of taking part in the midterm, receiving data, and being able to use the Spring semester to make modifications to instruction and provide remediation is the reason mandatory participation in EOC midterm exams would be extremely useful to increasing student achievement.
