Meeting was called to order at 2:23- 71% quorum

SAC Membership Installation of New/Returning Members:

- Need to vote on installation of new and returning members: Mr. Waganheim moved it and Ms. Edelman seconded it.
- Currently, we are looking for an ESOL parent to participate in SAC.

Approval of SAC By-Laws 2018-2019 Academic School Year:

- Discussed By-laws and changes. Officers were changed from one chair to co-chairs (Lisette Diaz and Nicole Gandolfo).
- By-laws approved by Lisette Diaz and Mr. Waganheim.

Review of Minutes from Final Meeting in the 2017-2018 Academic Year:

- At the last meeting in May of last year we did not make quorum, but can discuss the notes even though we do not need to approve them. Attendance must be 50% to vote on anything.
- Any questions on May minutes? There were no questions.

2017-2018 Data Review/Goals:

- Mrs. Morgan reviewed data from Reading, Math, and Science FSA scores.
- School improvement success 2018 was reviewed. Broward earned a "B" but only missed an "A" by 2%.
- All schools are required to have a SAC committee.

- Individuals who are elected are then approved by the principal and the SAC committee.
- We are not an "A" school this year. Mrs. Morgan talked to some families over the summer.
- Ms. Morgan explained how based on the FSA in 3rd grade they only look at proficiency for both reading and math. However, in 4th and 5th grade they look at proficiency and then learning gains. Ms. Morgan gave examples of learning gains.
- The 5th grade science test is only based on proficiency and we went from a 69% to a 52%.
- Scores went down in math in all areas.
- In reading we stayed the same.
- Mrs. Morgan went to a science training this summer with some of our teachers. Programming has changed this year and an emphasis has been placed on integrating science in all areas. Everyone is supposed to do one science experiment per week. All students will be taking a beginning, middle and end of the year science assessments.
- There is a huge emphasis on math this year. Teachers are doing small group math instruction in addition to whole group. This year we started Wylies. This allows students to see skills throughout the year- standards are repeated all year. Students are exposed to the concepts throughout the year. The more they see it the more they will understand it.
- Mrs. Morgan consulted with the math department to make sure that I-Ready math is rigorous for our students. They said that students should do 45 minutes per week. I-Ready has lessons/resources available for teachers.
- This year Kindergarten will start I-Ready in December.
- Reflex Math is still being used for fluency.
- Mr. Waganheim suggested that parents can use WhatsApp, so parents can support their kids and help each other.
- Math night was discussed as it is difficult to get parents to come in and learn about the math curriculum.
- Mrs. Morgan reiterated that parents should go to the teacher first with questions/concerns and before talking to administration.

School Improvement Plan (Developing):

- SAC composition needs to reflect the school community.
- We need an ESOL representative.
- It is important not to be absent or let the co-chairs know ahead of time please.
- Must have bylaws which we reviewed today.
- Reviewed last year's SIP plan and started to work on new plan for this year.
- It is important to monitor the SIP plan regularly to see if it needs to be revised.
- School Counseling Plan and Social/Emotional Learning plan are new under Best Practice #2.

SEI Plan/Counseling:

- Provide students with social and emotional learning skills.
- Looking at the whole child not just academics.
- PRIDE is reviewed daily with students.
- More emphasis is being placed on priorities for guidance and behavior plans.
- Look at the child in terms of personal, social and academics.

- Early intervention/resources are available- see Ms. Grant

Principal Report:

- Enrollment is at 974 students and our projection was 978.
- Only negative \$114 for the budget.
- Staff updates- 2 new cluster teachers (1 new additional class this year). 1st grade has 3 new teachers, 2nd grade has 1 new teacher, 4th grade has 1 new teacher.

Drills/Security/Safety:

- Code Red and Fire Drills will be conducted once a month. State legislation states that they must be done once a month for code red drills.
- Mrs. Morgan is looking at donations/quotes for a buzzer for the front door.

BTU- Ms. Edelman:

- Referendum money will be for SRO and Safety. A percentage will be for counselors and behavioral staff.
- Levinson was reelected for District 6.

Questions?

- Concerns about birthday celebrations was brought up by a parent. At this time, we do not celebrate birthdays at school. Mrs. Morgan agreed to bring it up at the next team leader meeting but stated that it will be a decision the team leaders will need to make.
