Motion to approve January SAC minutes by Jacob Abraham second by Christine Fris. Motion approved.
- IV. Officers' Report
 - A. School Improvement Plan (SIP)
 - i. **SIP Survey** - The SIP plan is located on the school's website and is constantly being updated
 - ii. **SAC Nominating Committee** - Briefly went over rules/bylaws for establishing a nominating committee for the 2019-2020 school year. Stefanie Tephford, Jacob Abraham and Debi Jaffe will serve as the nominating committee.
 - iii. **SAC Purpose** – slides were introduced explaining the purpose of SAC, the roles, responsibilities, membership, and attendance of the the members.

- VI. Principal's Report
- Graduation date and venue has been changed. The new date is Sunday June 2, at the BB&T in Sunrise
 - Thank you to the PTSO for 6 new picnic table and spirit flags. PTSO also sponsors the monthly birthday celebrations for faculty and staff. This Friday will be the annual Sweets and Treats for the faculty and staff.
 - Congratulations to our 3 National Merit Finalists: Joyce Guo, David Wu, and Florence Yared.
 - DECA participated last weekend in competition in Orlando, FL. Seventy-nine students won trophies, the most in school history, and will advance to International Competition at the end of April. Ms. Cutler, the DECA sponsor, was presented with the Outstanding Service Award from Florida DECA.
 - Culinary also competed this weekend in Orlando, FL. Students performed well in edible centerpieces, main culinary event and waiter's relay. Chef Kurth was awarded the Prostart Teacher of the Year from the National Restaurant Association.
 - Winter Guard competition was held at Stoneman Douglas this weekend. The MSD Winter Guard finished in 1st place.
 - On February 6, 2019, six MSD athletes signed with colleges/universities; 2 for softball, 1 for baseball and 2 for football.
 - Black Excellence Showcase in honor of Black History Month will be presented during the day on March 15 to students and also at 6:00 PM in the auditorium to the community. Come out to see these performances.

 - Course cards have been collected and students continue to meet with their guidance counselors about their courses for the 2019-2020 school year.
 - On February 14, 2019 there were about 300 students on campus to participate in service activities for our day of Service and Love. I want to thank all the students, staff and community members that participated in our Day of Service and Love in honor of our 17 fallen Eagles. I want to thank Hands on Broward for their individualized projects honoring each Eagle. Thank you to our local faith-based groups for their coordination of projects here

-On February 15, 2019, there were about 120 students present on campus. They participated in departmental activities throughout the day.

-Seventeen scholarships in honor of our 17 Fallen Angels have been created through the Broward Education Foundation. These \$1000 scholarships will be presented annually.

-New building update....meetings are taking place, inside walls will be constructed of masonry vs drywall, high windows will be placed on the south side of the building with larger windows placed on the north side of the building, all windows will be hurricane proof, entire south side (back area) will not be accessible.

-The school district has approved an additional BSO Deputy to solely monitor the portable area.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

This letter is to inform you that a Peer Counselor from Marjory Stoneman Douglas and a school-based mental health professional will be coming into your student's personalization period to provide students with a 20-30 minute presentation on Suicide Prevention. The training will cover the following topics:

- Warning signs of suicide
- Myths related to suicide
- Risk factors and protective factors
- How to respond to someone they are concerned about (online and in person)
- How to connect to school and community-based resources
- Information about national resources and online supportive Apps (MY3 App and A Friend Asks App)
- The importance of asking for help and seeking help for a friend, if concerned

The information in the presentation was taken from state and national experts on Suicide Prevention education. The resources utilized can be found at the following sites:

The goal of the presentation is to educate and increase awareness of the signs of suicide. The presentation will stay within the national guidelines for safe messaging on suicide prevention. Specifically, the presentation will be done in a small group setting and will be focused on help, hope and healing. The main objective is to ensure that students are aware of the resources available in the school and throughout the community and how to access them. Additionally, its focus is to remind them of the importance of peer to peer support. There will not be any stories or details about suicide shared during the presentation. Moreover, mental health staff will be present to identify any students in distress, whether expressed verbally or nonverbally. If a student is identified to be in distress, the counselor will meet with him/her individually, assess for risk, and address his/her needs immediately after the presentation concludes.

The presentation was developed by mental health professionals from the Broward County Public Schools Suicide Prevention Program along with the Peer Counseling students at MSD. **If you do not want your son/daughter to participate in this presentation, please complete the opt out below and submit to your child's Personalization Teacher by April 5, 2019.** If you would like more information about Suicide Prevention you are invited to attend a presentation hosted by Broward County Public Schools and the National Center for School Crisis and Bereavement on Wednesday, April 3, 2019 at 6pm in the Media Center. Thank you for your cooperation and support as we continue to support the needs of the students at Marjory Stoneman Douglas. The curriculum will begin in the personalization class on Monday, April 8th for those students for whom an opt-out form has not been returned.
