**SAC Minutes**

- I. **Welcome/Call to Order/Review of Agenda**
- II. **Attendance (Roll Call)**
- III. **Revision/Approval of March SAC minutes**- Revision of minutes will reflect the discussion from the March SAC meeting concerning Principal Mr. Thompson's lack of access to the safe haven report. Motion to approve by Stefanie Tephford and second by Jacob Abraham. Motion carried.
- IV. **Officer's Report**
  - a. **School Improvement Plan (SIP)** - We are continuing to monitor the plan
  - b. **School-wide Positive Behavior Plan (SPBP)** – Several questions and comment were generated about the purpose of the SPBP. Parents were concerned the plan is not relevant to the issues that are at this school. Displeasure was expressed about not having someone from BCPS present to answer questions concerning the plan. The plan will be voted on by the faculty.
  - c. **SAC School Accountability Funds - \$41161**
    - i. **Spring EOC camps** - \$12000 was requested to support the school's literacy goal for the EOC camps on Saturdays from January 2019 until May 2019. Motion by Carla Verba to approve request that \$12000 be put aside for the camps. second by Debi Jafee. Motion approved.
    - ii. **Florida Teen Reads** - \$591.00 spent out of \$600 for adding books to our media center to support our school's literacy goal.
    - iii. **Reading program for new books** - \$400 of SAC school accountability funds for support of our school's literacy goal
    - iv. **Speech Convention Request** – Rachel Archambault requested \$780 to attend a speech convention in June to support our SEL plan. She will be presenting and also bringing back best practices for our school. Motion by Robert Mayersohn to approve, second by Jacob Abraham. Motion approved.

- v. **Florida Teen Reads** – Diana Haneski requested \$2000 to purchase books for the Florida Teen Reads program. Motion by Robert Mayersohn to approve, second by Stefanie Tephford. Motion approved.

V. **Special orders/unfinished business from previous meeting** – none

VI. **Principal's Report** – Ms. Teresa Hall presented the principal's report. The following was included

- Reminder of the Super Testing Days- May 1, 2, 3, 6, 7 Days set aside for FSA and EOCs testing. Testing days will be from 7:40 am until 11:40 am each day.

- Seniors will attend Grad Bash on Friday, April 12

- Underclass and Senior Awards nights are underway

- Stoneman Douglas was chosen by Holister as the winner of the ultimate school prom.

- Eagle's Haven, an off campus wellness center, is now up and running

- New Building Report – Ground should be broken on or around June 1, 2019, old portables will be removed.

- Spring sports are currently on going

- Several questions were put forth concerning

- Guard building in front of school – Hoping the building will be delivered to school by Monday, April 15. A security campus monitor will be posted there.

- Discussion concerning the suicide prevention presentations that are being rolled out to each personalization classroom over the next few days – parents voiced concerns about how this was being done, who was presenting the information to students, the opt-out forms, and how the material will be presented to the students.

- Individual parents asked several security issues – is there a school phone number someone can call if there is an immediate security concern. Ms. Hall stated she would look into it.

VII. **Special guest** – (unannounced) **Mr. Brian Katz – Chief of Safety and Security**

Brian Katz, Director over safety and security for BCPS, was present. Mr. Katz introduced himself by giving his professional background before coming to our district. Mr. Katz stated he was "making the rounds to various meetings to talk to the community."

Mr. Katz's presentation included the following:

He is not here to ensure safety and security. That is not the reality of the situation. He introduced three elements to build holistically minded priorities to security: prevention, response, and recovery.

He believes the focus should be to create a safe environment in a school and community, but how do we do this. This will be an ongoing process. He believes some great things concerning safety are going on but there is not consistency across the board. The county is doing things, actively accomplishing things but there still is lots of work to do.

Mr. Katz believes training must be improved. He stated teachers know their classrooms best, allow teachers to plan their own proposals for their classrooms, allow teachers to plan out different scenarios and to have conversations with their peers about safety measures. He believes there is a positive outcome by practicing safety measures with teachers.

When asked about drills, such as code red, code yellow, Mr. Katz stated we have to improve training. The drills we are having now as mandated by the legislature is not the best way to train people. This is not the best way to improve outcome.

Mr. Katz is in favor of organizing students to talk about what issues they have with security, what makes them feel unsafe and then allow students to address these issues and discuss possible solutions.

Mr. Katz took questions from parents.
