“Stop the Bleeding” Trainings

November 2nd ~ Over the last eight weeks, nearly 6,000 Broward County teachers and staff members at more than 85 public elementary, middle and high schools have completed a 'Stop The Bleed' emergency and first aid training course. Participants learn to use tourniquets and dress fake gashes and bullet wounds. The idea is to be able to stop severe bleeding and take care of significant wounds before paramedics arrive.

Hanley Foundation Partners with Broward County School District

Hanley Foundation, a community leader in substance abuse prevention programming throughout Florida, recently partnered with the Broward County School District's Diversity, Prevention & Intervention Department (DPI) to present the 2018 Teen Summit, the second of a planned annual event designed to bring educators and student leaders together to work on programs to prevent substance abuse and conflict, and to foster greater understanding of cultural diversity and enhance positive school environments. More than 260 students from 40 middle and high schools throughout Broward County attended the 2018 Teen Summit, held at Pompano Beach High School.

BCPS Receives Three Grants to Support School Safety, under the STOP School Violence Act

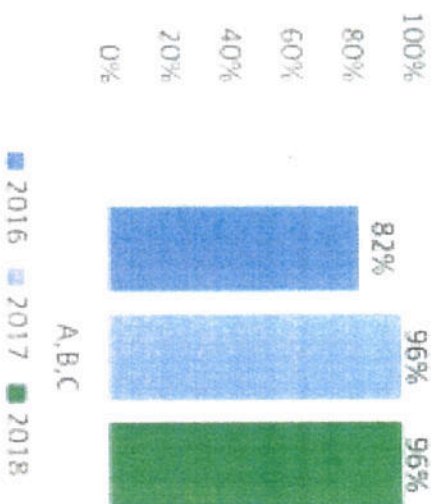
BCPS is proud to receive three recent grant awards from the U.S. Department of Justice. The combined total of the three grants is more than \$1.3 million to support school-safety related programs across BCPS. The grants are authorized by the STOP School Violence Act and are intended to improve school security by reducing exposure to risks, preventing actions of violence, and recognizing and responding to violent acts.

Broward County School Choice Application Window Opens December 1

Beginning December 1, Broward County Public Schools will open the School Choice application window for the 2019/20 school year on December 1, where parents can apply online for a school reassignments, Nova and magnet programs. During the window lasting through February 6, 2019, parents are encouraged to explore all of the district's School Choice options available for their families. Whether parents apply December 1 or February 6, they still have the same chance of getting accepted into an available school, and if there are more applications than seats, it will go into a lottery. Also, magnet and Nova schools provide bus service, a school reassignment does not.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SUCCESS 2018

96 percent of innovative District schools earned an "A," "B" or "C"



84 percent of innovative District schools maintained or increased their letter grade

57 innovative District schools earned an "A." Only one school received an "F"

31 innovative District schools increased by one or more letter grades

BCPS earned a District grade of "B" for the fifth year in a row, narrowly missing an "A" designation by two percentage points
