- Establish quorum and review of previous minutes. The meeting began at 3:19pm Karissa Sutton motioned to adopt the minutes. Krissy Wong seconded.

New Business

- o SIP Website http://www.broward.k12.fl.us/ospa/select-school.asp
- Response To Intervention (RtI)/ Best Practice #2 an Embedded High Quality RtI Process- Ashley Exterkamp. Ashley Exterkamp explained that RTI stands for Response to Intervention. There is a referral to the RTI team on BASIS. There are three tiers. Tier I includes the Positive Behavior plan. Tier I should meet 85% of students. Tier II and Tier III are for students who don't respond to lower level strategies. All strategies are outlined in the SIP.

Old Business

- A+ Money update 77% of faculty voted for Option A. 100% of money will go to faculty and staff. Results of this vote will be uploaded to the SIP.
- o Waiver update-This is the five year PSD waiver. We have turned in the waiver intent form. The application is due in mid-February. Our old waiver has expired. We have to have three public meetings. This one is the first. The next will be January 9th in the media center. Public meeting number 3 is January 14th, our SAC meeting where the ballot will be formed. The week of January 21-25th, the faculty will vote on the PSD waiver. We will need 66 2/3 % support. Karissa Sutton spoke in favor of the PSDs. She pointed out that if we do not have the PSDs, we would have to do PSD in the hours after school. On past PSDs we have focused on PD that has been aimed at understanding dyslexia, school security, PSD will be aimed at helping faculty understand the new county learning system. We may not take all 8 days. We will vote later on how many days we will take. This year we chose to have 6 PSDs. Ms. Tortorella made a motion to vote. 17 voted in favor. 2 voted against.
- ❖ PTSO/ IZone Update Luncheon for teachers and staff will be on Thursday. SAT and ACT prep classes start in January. Parents can sign up on the school's website. Score At the Top offers an online test that will tell students whether they should take the ACT or SAT. The classes are \$250 a piece. Each class is 8 weeks. Coral Springs PD also runs

simulations for SAT that use teenagers as the tutors to tutor other students. Ms. Tortorella asked for a clarification concerning exam exemptions. Mr. Wood added that students who are excused from exams will have excused absences for those time periods. Students who want to leave early have to be signed out by a parent. Ms. Erskine and Corey Nadler expressed a desire that more information concerning exemption procedures, sign out procedures and other topics be more clearly communicated to freshmen parents.

- ❖ Principal's Update Mr. Carruth had to leave early. Ms. Brissett and Mr. Alonso pointed out that the drama club won several awards at districts, Chorus went to Candlelight and two students were chosen for Questbridge scholarships.





PSD Public Meeting for Comments January 17, 2019

Meeting called to order by Roxane Brissett at 3:05

What is the barrier that PSD address? Schools have the flexibility to utilize up to 27 hours a year for professional development.

How many additional hours of PSD does the waiver give? The PSD waiver could give up to 36 hours of additional development each year.

How do additional PSDs align with the SIP? Per the SIP, "27 hours is an insufficient time for teachers to accomplish PD. More hours are needed to implement best practices, prepare for EOCs, iObservation, etc.

How does this help teachers renew their certificates? In order to re-certify, teachers must show they have continued their education. To re-certify there must be 120 hours of PD. The PSDs will allow teachers to re-certify after two years, 60 hours each year.

The waiver is approved for up to five years, as long as faculty reconfirm it every year.

The waiver must be presented to the faculty and pass by 66 2/3 majority. Part 2 must pass by 51%. This second vote determines how many days of PSD there shall be.

SAC can offer up to 8 days (can be less) each year.

Ms. Coy spoke up saying there is an advantage in having the waiver. It helps teachers coordinate their teaching for EOCs and common subjects even if the teachers involved do not have common planning.

Megan Maldonado, 9th grade English teacher: "As a new teacher, the PSDs have been incredibly helpful. These days were the only chance to meet with more experienced teachers and improve my teaching and learn best practices. Also, being in a grade level that has state testing, it has been great to meet and talk about what is working and what is not working. I take what I learn back and apply it directly to my teaching. As far as concerns that the days are too short for students, I don't have that problem. My lessons move forward on those days and my students know that we will be doing work on the PSDs. These days have been very important."

Jose, student- "PSD days are invaluable. As an AP and AICE student, the homework we have can reach 5 hours a day. The PSD is valuable for helping us subsidize our sleep schedules."

Britteny Angel, Student-"When I was a student in Honduras, we had 12 classes a day. When I came here, I had to catch up so much. The PSDs helped me catch up and helped me work harder and get stuff done."

Michael, Student-PSDs help students who have after-school activities. IT gives us time to catch up

Gabby, Student-There should be PSDs because we don't have much time left. If I want a break, I need a break!

Victor, student- I think PSDs are very beneficial. But it comes down to what the teachers think.

Ramsey, student-Though PSDs are short days, if students use their time wisely, they will be able to get the work done. It gives you time to catch up on homework. For me, I plan to be launching my second business and it allows me time to plan for certain things, like planning funding and setting up websites for my business. I also feel it's important to take some time for yourself. With PSD you feel like you have some time to give yourself some relief.

Chelsea, student- Why do teachers not want PSD? Ms. Coy answered, sometimes we feel we have wasted a day because students skip the day and don't get the content. Ramsey said, a student who feels they don't have a reason to go to school will skip school regardless of whether it's a PSD or not.

Sydney, student-On PSDs, my mother (Tammy Schoen) and I will blow through so much work. And when she's happy, I'm happy.

Brittney, yes, it's true that some kids are slacking, the ones that come are the ones who really care about their grades.

Chelsea, it's mainly kids who miss the days are the ones that aren't keeping up anyway.

Megan Maldonado, teacher-Some of my study hall students shared their thoughts. Some students said they use PSDs allow them to organize themselves, catch up and prevent themselves from becoming overwhelmed.

Vincent, Dual enrollment student, "I use PSD to catch up on my work in my dual enrollment classes. It also allows me to catch up on my other responsibilities."

Tammy Schoen, "No one has mentioned study hall which has not existed previously. The problem is that now students don't use study hall time wisely. That's an issue. And I find that the AP kids are some of the worst when it comes to missing classes on PSD. And when we went to block scheduling, we lost a great deal of time. And PSD causes us to lose even more time. Struggling students need every minute they can get of instruction. PSD takes that time away from them."

Michael Delgado, "From my experience in my study hall, the teacher set up a good system to help us utilize our time.

Karissa Sutton, teacher-"According to our contract, not every teacher should feel the need to structure the students' time in study hall. That is a personalization period that students and teachers should feel as they see fit."

Chris, student-"One view that hasn't been expressed, if students are working on a test that has a hard deadline, PSD can cause us to lose a lot of time. If we are going to have PSD, we should try to schedule those so that the students can have enough time to prepare for those tests"

Danielle Bradley, teacher- "As a teacher, my responsibility is to make sure my students are prepared for AICE and FSA exams. I've done the math. From PSD, we lose 210 hours. On the block schedule, that's 4-5 days of lost time. When you add in county days, we have lost 6-7 days of instructional time. This year, A days lost 140 minutes. On B days they lost 70 hours. As a school, we know that our performance on those tests affects our school grade. As we have gone through this PSD waiver, our grade suffered on the year that we had 8 days. When we reduced to 6 days, our grade went up to a B and our graduation rate also went up to record levels. I tell my students, you will have chill time. You

have summers off, winter break and other days off. You will have time to relax. We are looking at the whole picture for everybody. In March, in a five week span, we have 3 short days.

Krissy Wong, teacher- is there any way we can look at the schedule and make sure the PSD is equally spread between A and B days.

Mr. Carruth, the answer is that maybe we could balance those days. If the waiver passes, we can only go up to 8. Within those 8, the District tells us which days we can take as PSD. If you have less than 8, you can pick which days you take. But the District makes it a specific day each month, take it or leave it.

Ms. Rodriguez, teacher-Technology is not something we have talked about. The District has bought a lot of technology, but not given us enough time to train. We need the time to train for some of that technology and to train from one another. We need professional development time. How can I help my students if I'm not given the time to meet with my peers and have that time with them?

Ramsey, "If the time lost from PSD days, could teachers tape their lessons and put them on Canvas, in order to make up for that lost time from the PSD?

Danielle Tortorella, parent- "I did not realize that parents allowed their kids to stay home." Mr. Carruth said there is a drop off, but he doesn't know the percentage off the tip of his head. Mrs. Tortorella said perhaps the word should go out to parents that PSDs are regular school days and it should be made clear it is NOT a day off. Mrs. Tortorella also asked, "Do teachers find that students take in only a certain amount of information in a certain time period?" Mrs. Schoen said there is less time to teach content, so she argues that time should not be taken away from the classroom.

PSD Q and A

Q: What is the barrier that the Professional Study Days waiver addresses?

A: Article Five: Conditions of Employment; Section L: Teacher Planning Days L.3 – Schools have flexibility on how to utilize up to their current allocation of twenty-seven (27) hours per year of the total time available for professional development, exclusive of time allocated for teacher planning and preparation. Professional development activities shall be scheduled on planning days and two additional early release days exclusive of the four (4) early release days specified in section W.

Q: How many additional hours of professional development does the PSD waiver give?

A: In addition to the allocated 27 hours per year, the PSD waiver can give us up to 33 additional hours for a total of 60 hours of professional development per year.

Q: How does this help teachers?

A: Per the School Improvement Best Practice #4- College and Career Readiness, 27 hours is an insufficient amount of time for teachers to engage in professional development to properly prepare them to achieve the specified goals. Additional time is necessary for needed professional development on the adopted Common Core state standards, various subject area End of Course Exam preparations, implementation of Marzano high yield teaching strategies, sharing best practices and comparing student data through Professional Learning Communities, and time for reflection and improvement as it pertains to iObservation and the teacher evaluation system. The additional time for professional development will be offered to teachers within school operating hours.

Q: How does this help teachers recertify their professional teaching certificate?

A: Teachers are required to recertify every 5 years. In order to recertify teachers must prove that they have continued their education. This can be done through taking post-secondary classes, attending professional development workshops offered through the district after school hours, or through in-house professional development offered by the school. Teachers must have 120 inservice points equivalent to 120 hours of professional development in order to recertify. Teachers will have enough inservice points to recertify after 2 years under the PSD waiver. Without the PSD waiver, it will take teachers all five years to have enough inservice points through in-house professional development.

Q: How does this help students?

A: Professional development and teacher collaboration through Professional Learning Communities leads to teachers providing quality instruction to their students. Quality instruction increases student achievement.

Q: What is the length of this waiver?

A: The waiver is automatically approved by the School Board for 5 years. However, the faculty will vote to continue the waiver for each year.

Q: What are the next steps?

A: SAC will create the waiver and the ballot for the faculty vote. BTU will conduct the faculty vote. The waiver must be presented to the faculty in writing at least three days prior to the vote. The vote (Part 1) must pass by 66 2/3 majority and part 2 must pass by 51%. If a faculty member does not vote then that counts as a No. School Board Policy 1403

Q: Does SAC have to offer all 8 days?

A: SAC can offer the faculty options for the number of Professional Study Days

Q: What are the dates for the Professional Study Days for the 2019-2020 school year?

A: To be determined by the School Board of Broward County

- PSD waiver Dr. Bradley said there are pros and cons. Yes, we can meet with one another and get some great strategies. But then PSDs means I have less time with my students to implement those strategies.
- O Waiver vote-Roxanne Brissett made it clear that we do not have to take all 8 days. Mr. Carruth asked if wavier renewals are staggered. Ms. Brissett said they are staggered. Mr. Carruth pointed out the School Board must approve whatever waiver our school comes up with. Mrs. Brissett opened the floor up for discussion as to how many days we will take. • In addition to the four early release days currently scheduled, the District shall provide that the students at Coral Glades High School shall be dismissed three hours early (11:50AM) for eight additional days during the school year for the purpose of High School Reform. The additional Professional Study Days will be determined by the School Board. We are requesting that this waiver be approved for five years. Additionally, the school will analyze the data each year to determine whether to continue the waiver as is, adjust the number of days requested, or to discontinue the waiver.

IX. State the rationale for the proposed waiver. How will the proposed waiver support school improvement? Give background information, history of barrier, etc.

Per the School Improvement Best Practice #4- College and Career Readiness, 27 hours is an insufficient amount of time for teachers to engage in professional development to properly prepare them to achieve the specified goals. Additional time is necessary for needed professional development on the adopted Common Core state standards, various subject area End of Course Exam preparations, implementation of Marzano high yield teaching strategies, sharing best practices and comparing student data through Professional Learning Communities, and time for self-reflection and improvement as it pertains to iObservation and the teacher evaluation system. The additional time for professional development will be offered to teachers within school operating hours.

- X. Recognizing that one strategy alone does not affect school-wide achievement, identify and explain the baseline data for the proposed waiver.
 - Coral Glades High School received a grade of C for the 2016-2017 school year. Our grade improved to a B for the 2017-2018 school year. The 2017-2018 School year data is as follows: English Language Achievement: 59% learning gains 59% learning gains of the lowest quartile 48%. Math: 54% learning gains 42% learning gains of the lowest quartile 41%. Science: 60% proficient. Social Studies: 70% proficient. Graduation rate: 4 year 94%. College and Career Readiness: 55%. The above data is a result of additional professional study days that allows time for professional learning communities focused on improving student achievement.

XI. What reliable research studies, proven strategies, best practices, or similar programs support the probable success of the proposed waiver?

- Florida's High School Reform Task Force has established four goals that include (1) increase the academic achievement levels of high school students, (2) increase the percent of high school graduates, (3) increase the percentage of graduates who begin their post secondary path to college or career while in a Florida high school and (4) change the culture.

PSD Q and A

Q: What is the barrier that the Professional Study Days waiver addresses?

A: Article Five: Conditions of Employment; Section L: Teacher Planning Days L.3 – Schools have flexibility on how to utilize up to their current allocation of twenty-seven (27) hours per year of the total time available for professional development, exclusive of time allocated for teacher planning and preparation. Professional development activities shall be scheduled on planning days and two additional early release days exclusive of the four (4) early release days specified in section W.

Q: How many additional hours of professional development does the PSD waiver give?

A: In addition to the allocated 27 hours per year, the PSD waiver can give us up to 33 additional hours for a total of 60 hours of professional development per year.

Q: How does this help teachers?

A: Per the School Improvement Best Practice #4- College and Career Readiness, 27 hours is an insufficient amount of time for teachers to engage in professional development to properly prepare them to achieve the specified goals. Additional time is necessary for needed professional development on the adopted Common Core state standards, various subject area End of Course Exam preparations, implementation of Marzano high yield teaching strategies, sharing best practices and comparing student data through Professional Learning Communities, and time for self-reflection and improvement as it pertains to iObservation and the teacher evaluation system. The additional time for professional development will be offered to teachers within school operating hours.

Q: How does this help teachers recertify their professional teaching certificate?

A: Teachers are required to recertify every 5 years. In order to recertify teachers must prove that they have continued their education. This can be done through taking post-secondary classes, attending professional development workshops offered through the district after school hours, or through in-house professional development offered by the school. Teachers must have 120 inservice points equivalent to 120 hours of professional development in order to recertify. Teachers will have enough inservice points to recertify after 2 years under the PSD waiver. Without the PSD waiver, it will take teachers all five years to have enough inservice points through in-house professional development.

Q: How does this help students?

A: Professional development and teacher collaboration through Professional Learning Communities leads to teachers providing quality instruction to their students. Quality instruction increases student achievement.

Q: What is the length of this waiver?

A: The waiver is automatically approved by the School Board for 5 years. However, the faculty will vote to continue the waiver for each year.

Q: What are the next steps?

A: SAC will create the waiver and the ballot for the faculty vote. BTU will conduct the faculty vote. The waiver must be presented to the faculty in writing at least three days prior to the vote. The vote (Part 1) must pass by 66 2/3 majority and part 2 must pass by 51%. If a faculty member does not vote then that counts as a No. School Board Policy 1403
