- Establish quorum and review of previous minutes. 27/33 members are present. A quorum is established. The meeting was called to order at 3:03pm by Roxanne Brissett. Brisson was mis-spelled in the October minutes. Ms. Tortorella motioned to accept the minutes and Jose seconded.

#### New Business

- o SMART Program
- A+ Money Roxane explained how A+ money was distributed the last time the school received it in 2013-14. One of the options on any ballot must be "None the above" In 2013-14 Option A won the vote. This meant that anyone employed at Coral Glades in the 2012-13 school year shared in the money, including people who had since retired or left the school. Tammy recommended that Option B be spelled out more specifically in the ballot, such as how each department would spend their share of the 5%. If no choice is chosen by the faculty by the deadline, 100% of the money would go to teachers CURRENTLY IN A CLASSROOM THIS YEAR. Mrs. Tortorella spoke strongly in favor of the Option B, which would call for 5% of the money be distributed for use in the individual departments. Ms. Brissett clarified that SAC could write the ballot specifying that 5% of the money be distributed to each department. Karissa Sutton led a discussion asking that there be clarification as to how the money should be divided among the departments. Chelsea asked if extracurriculars could get the money. The answer was no. But if the extracurricular is part of the department, then it could get some money. Steven Beauchamp said other department members like cafeteria or custodial would be more likely to support sharing 100% of the money, because the other option (B) would diminish their personal bonus. And this bonus may be the only bonus they might receive. Mrs. Tortorella asked if department heads explain the ballot to their teams. Mrs. Schoen said she would try to clarify the language, but not propose the way to vote. Mr. Wood said there is usually a faculty meeting where the ballot is explained, prior to the vote. Dr. Bradley said most teachers pick Option A because it is the only financial reward the teachers get for their hard work. Mrs. Tortorella said the students also work hard and should get the money. Mrs. Brissett said SAC can allocate money to reward students. Mrs. Brissett put the ballot to a vote. Zero voted to leave the ballot as is. The second question was should the ballot say, "5% of the money will be divided equally among all the departments of the school, including non-instructional staff"= 25 people voted to support this ballot language. The final vote was whether the percentage should be increased to 8% = 5people voted for this. The decision was to keep it at 5%. The only change for this year's ballot is that the language will say "5% of the money will be divided equally among all eligible departments."

A team from the county came to give a presentation on SMART bond money spending. Assistant Project Manager explained that at Coral Glades there will be fire alarm, HVAC, athletics, single point of entry and school choice projects budged for 2.26 million dollars. There will be new roofs placed on all three buildings. School choice options could include: laptops and computer upgrades, outdoor furniture, marquee upgrades, indoor furniture and murals. Tammy Schoen asked if SMART money would be used for an auditorium. Since that would cost more than \$3 million, the auditorium would not be part of the SMART money. As far as single point of entry, more fencing would be added to prevent people from coming in from the faculty parking lot if those people are not faculty. SAC voted unanimously to recommend Option B to the faculty and staff.



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# Coral Glades High School Options for A+ Money distribution



- A. 100% of the A+ funds will be divided equally amongst ALL faculty, administration, and support staff that were employed for more than 50% of the 2017-2018 school calendar year (this includes all former faculty, administration and support staff members who are not currently working at CGHS). Part-time employees will receive bonus money proportional to the time they worked per week (i.e. If they worked 20% of the week, their bonus money will be only 20% of the total).
- B. The school will receive 5% of the A+ Funds to be dispersed evenly between eligible departments. The remaining 95% of the allotted School Recognition funds will be equally divided amongst ALL faculty, administration and support staff who were employed for more than 50% of the 2017-2018 school calendar year (includes all former faculty, administration and support staff members who are not currently working at CGHS). Part-time employees will receive bonus money proportional to the time they worked per week (i.e. If they worked 20% of the week, their bonus money will be only 20% of the total).

## C. None of the above

#### Option A Rationale

In Option A, 100% of the A+ funds will be utilized for one-time bonuses to faculty and staff.

The A+ funds will be disbursed equally between full time Instructional and Non-Instructional staff members. This includes administrators, teachers, guidance counselors, clerical, security, cafeteria, media, and all support staff.

Part-time employees will receive bonus money proportional to the time they worked per week (i.e. If they worked 20% of the week, their bonus money will be only 20% of the total).

Option A example: If dispersal amount equals \$266,000 and 168 faculty and staff were employed at Coral Glades High for the majority of the 2017-2018 school year, then each person would receive approximately \$1583.

#### **Option B Rationale**

In Option B, 5% of the A+ funds will be dispersed evenly between eligible departments.

These funds will be disbursed at the discretion of each department head/chair with input from each department member.

The remaining 95% of the A+ funds will be utilized for one-time bonuses to faculty and staff.

The A+ funds will be disbursed equally between full time Instructional and Non-Instructional staff members. This includes administrators, teachers, guidance counselors, clerical, security, cafeteria, media, and all support staff.

Part-time employees will receive bonus money proportional to the time they worked per week (i.e. If they worked 20% of the week, their bonus money will be only 20% of the total).

Option B example: If dispersal amount equals \$266,000 and 168 faculty and staff were employed at Coral Glades High for the majority of the 2017-2018 school year, then each person would receive approximately \$1504. The departments would receive \$13,300 to be divided equally among them.

Florida Statue 1008.36 states that, "If school staff and the School Advisory Council cannot reach agreement by February 1, the awards must be equally distributed to all classroom teachers currently teaching in the school."

#### Florida School Recognition Program (A+ Funds) Process and Q and A

- **Step 1:** The School Advisory Council (SAC) creates written proposals in the form of a ballot for the expenditure of the funds:
  - a. The ballot lists the options for dispensing the A+ Funds.
  - b. One of the options on the ballot must be "none of the above."
  - c. The ballot must be presented to the faculty and staff a minimum of three work days prior to the vote.

Approved ballot/proposal must be uploaded to SAC Upload center.

- Step 2: A written proposal is presented to the staff at least 3 days before the vote.
- Step 3: Faculty and staff must vote by secret ballot on the proposals.
  - a. The proposal with the majority of votes is implemented.
  - b. A majority is one more than half of the total school employees.
    - a. 168 employees according to staff list pulled on 10/3/2018
- (Q) What happens if no proposal or "none of the above" receives the majority of votes?
- (A)If no proposal or "none of the above" receives the majority of votes, then the SAC reconvenes again and creates different proposals to be presented and voted on at another meeting. (Same as step 1.)
- (Q) Can we elect to do a combination of things with the money, or must it be spent for one purpose?
- (A) The money may be divided among several projects, i.e., bonus plus equipment/material or bonus plus temporary staff, etc.
- (Q) How many proposals does the SAC need to give to employees?
- (A) The SAC may create several proposals, although the final vote may be a choice of 1 or 2 proposal(s) and a choice of none of the above.
- (Q) How are SAC proposals communicated to the faculty and staff at the school?
- (A) They are posted a minimum of three days in prominent locations so that all faculty and staff have the opportunity to view them.
- (Q) Who votes on the ballot proposed by SAC?
- (A) All school employees currently on staff
- (Q) Can past employees who transferred to another school vote?
- (A) No.
