MATH NEWS

BUILDING MATH FLUENCY IS KEY TO MATH SUCCESS

Math fluency can be defined as having the ability to add, subtract, multiply and divide accurately, quickly and without effort. Students who are able to achieve this skill with automaticity will be able to master math problems in their future or in their long term memory with great success. Building math fluency skills in students in grades K-5 will ensure students' future math success in middle school, high school and beyond. Studies show that fluency in math leads to: higher order mathematics, less confusion, better performance in other subjects such as geography and science, and less math anxiety in students (K5 learning.com).

Here at Driftwood ES, we have put a program in place to help your students build math fluency skills. Our online program such as reflexmath.com helps to build students math fluency skills in grades K-5. Students can work on addition and subtraction skills in grades 1 & 2 and multiplication and division skills in grades 3 and above. Students need to log on and achieve "green light" status to ensure that they are becoming more fluent in math operations. Milestones are achieved once students have learned new math facts and gain fluency of the math facts. We encourage all Driftwood parents to make sure their boys and girls are logged on to reflexmath.com at home at least three times a week to ensure their progress in math fact fluency.
