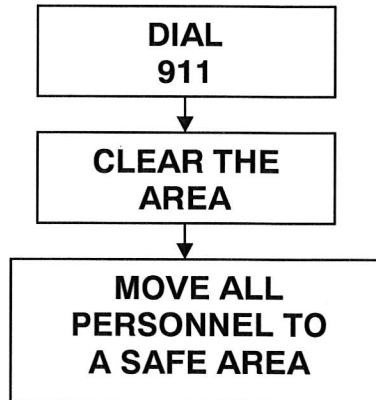


Safety Update

African Bees (a.k.a. Killer Bees, Africanized Bees) Alert



If you suspect an active African Bee hive on a school site or in the area around a school:

- 1. DIAL 911 to alert authorities of the possible danger. Potential bee nesting sites:**

Holes or cracks in building walls	Holes in trees
Underneath mobile homes	Colverts or drainage pipes
Flower pots	Old tires
Bird houses	Sheds
- 2. For an inactive bee hive on a school site, call COMPASS at (754) 321-4490 and request a work order. It will be given top priority.**
- 3. Call the Physical Plant Operations Department at (754) 321-4600 and advise the dispatch office of the school and the location of the bee hive.**

If you see someone attacked by bees:

- 1. DIAL 911**
- 2. Do not remove bee stingers with fingers or tweezers. This forces toxins into the victim's body.**
- 3. Scrape stingers off the skin with a blunt instrument or plastic card.**

If attacked by bees:

- 1. Cover your head and run for shelter. Standing and swatting will only provoke more attacks.**
- 2. Do not jump into water. Bees will wait until you come up for air to attack.**
- 3. SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION IMMEDIATELY.**
- 4. Dial 911 to alert authorities of the danger.**
