SMART Facilities Update

Since our last SMART Update, **98 new SMART projects have been initiated** for an updated total of **683** facilities projects that are currently in various phases of the SMART process. This marks an investment of \$475 million as of September 30, 2016. The SMART program remains on track to be completed within five to seven years, as originally promised.

▶ In September 2016, SMART projects at five schools, with budgets totaling over \$26 million, received School Board approval to begin the process of advertising and hiring design teams.

- ▶ In September 2016, SMART projects at two schools, received School Board approval to begin the process of preparing drawings/plans for contractors.
 - Wingate Oaks Center (District 1) Fire alarm, media center improvements, replacement of HVAC equipment in buildings 1, 2, 4, and 5, building envelope improvements
 - Ramblewood Elementary School (District 4) Fire sprinklers, PE/athletic improvements, media center improvements, HVAC improvements, building envelope improvements
- ▶ By leveraging the pool of pre-qualified and School Board approved architects and contractors through continuing service agreements, 28 schools have initiated improvements totaling over \$31 million; projects include single-point of entry, ADA, fire alarm and sprinklers, building envelope and media center renovations.

The BCPS Department of Professional Development Standards and Support is providing professional development opportunities related to the SMART initiative and technology integration in schools. Teachers can earn five successive qualifications aimed at supporting blended classroom environments and incorporating 21st century teaching and learning.

The District is proud to announce that 84 District schools have now achieved 21st Century Learner School status for having at least 90 percent of their staff successfully complete the Level 1 21st Century Learner Qualification professional development program. This includes a total of 4,818 staff members at these schools. Congratulations to the schools' principals and staff for their

hard work and dedication! An additional 87 schools are currently in the process of earning their 21st Century Learner Qualification.
