

VU Learning Communities Extended in CAB

Virtual University has established a New CAB Conference under Instructional Resources. Teachers and staff can continue the learning communities that started during the online courses with Virtual University and hosted by Blackboard. Each course content area will have a separate conference area and participants can go under Collaborate in CAB and add the conference to their CAB desktop for easy access.



New Online Course Listings will be sent to all schools in April for Summer and Fall registration. Look for the blue and yellow folders. There is an entry form attached to receive a free notepad and to be entered into several drawings for digital cameras.

Course facilitators will direct participants who complete a course to go the CAB Conference area. These Learning Communities will be available to all CAB users and anyone may visit, view and post to the conference. Potential participants may obtain information or join discussion to find out more about the course or related content. Mr. Williams' American History, Honors students were challenged to learn about a certain historical event, movement, or social issue and explore its meaning through the use of song. Throughout history, people have searched for meaning and peace through the singing of songs, and with this tradition in mind, students analyzed 20th century songs and chose either an event or issue to explain through music. Along with a 3-5 page research paper, each student created a music video or "movie" using Windows Movie Maker, PowerPoint, or iMovie to explain the historical, social, or environmental issue.




