



#### How will this work?

(For a period of time) CAB TIPS will be mailed to all CAB users on a weekly basis. TIPS are created as a result of the most commonly asked questions and issues presented to the CAB Q&A Conference. Once the TIP is mailed, it will remain available through the "TIPS Conference" located in the CAB Q&A for future reference.


The *TIPS* conference is not a replacement of end-user training, but rather a supplement - a "Did You Know?"

### CAB TIP #1: How to create a "phone message" template

By default, to create a phone message, you have to select message>new message special>phone call, each time you need to generate a "phone message."

There is no shortcut or toolbar icon that can be used to accomplish this, so creating a template that can be used and reused is a recommended solution.

Select	Message>New	Message
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When the "phone call" window opens, close it immediately. (see screen shot below)

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If your mailbox has a split view, the newly closed "draft" phone call" message will appear with your messages and not with your folders. (See the CAB TIP on Splitting your window)

Select the draft "phone call" message (see screen shot at the beginning of the next column).

Go to file>get info (mac) or file>properties (win). From the "get info" or "properties" window, give your "phone call" a name and subject and select "stationery" to make it a "template". Select "OK".

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Your "phone call" template will now appear with your folders and not with your messages. You can use this template over and over again by selecting it each time you need to generate a "phone call" message. (see screen shot below)

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# Whole School DETA Implementations Produce Results Pompano Beach High School

Pompano Beach High School prepared for their move into a brand new, state-of-the-art facility by doing more than just packing. The entire faculty, including Principal, Mr. William Bell, all three Assistant Principals, the Guidance Counselors, Magnet Coordinator, physical education teachers, art teachers, science teachers, English and foreign language teachers... in fact <u>all</u> teachers... took the Digital Education Teacher Academy together. They used their time to plan ways to meaningfully engage students in higher order thinking, collaboration, and interdisciplinary learning. They also planned ways to maximize the impact of technology integration with the move to the new school building.

The hands-on, constructivist learning model of DETA engages teachers in designing projectbased learning experiences to implement in their classrooms. As a result, students in Ms. Vanessa Bruton's Business Systems and Technology class wrote, illustrated, and published children's picture books for the "Create-A-Book" project which were shared with students at nearby elementary schools. Students in Mr. Jeff Williams's American History class created powerful multimedia presentations set to music in "Let the Music Move You... Through History!" Ms. Gregory Zolna's art students explored the timeless essential question of why humans are compelled to create in the WebQuest, "Why Create?"

The move into the new school has facilitated the integration of technology with projectbased learning for teachers and students. The state-of-the-art facility features wireless technology and multimedia wireless computer carts for anywhere, anytime learning.


