Students will analyze the impact that previous judicial decisions have made to contemporary life in the United States and will be expected to evaluate constitutional positions associated with major issues. This course will incorporate the development of a written appellate brief addressing a contemporary constitutional question and the presentation of oral arguments to defend their position legally. Students will also evaluate opinions issued by the Florida and US Supreme Courts as well as lower courts. This course is designed to provide an in-depth study of this topic to students who are interested in pursuing post secondary careers in law, law enforcement, governmental service, or a law related field.

Eastern and Western Heritage will provide students the opportunity to study the chronological and topical development of human civilization in Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Meso-America and Europe. Topics of study will include the birth of civilizations, the growth and decline of specific civilizations, the role of isolation and interaction in civilization development, and the emergence of social, political and economic institutions and philosophies.

SPECIAL NOTE: *This course, offered at 9th grade, is the first course of a three year sequence. If coupled with Visions and Their Pursuits (offered at 10th grade), and Visions and Countervisions (offered at 11th grade) the sequence will fulfill the graduation requirement for United States and World History. All three years must be successfully completed for graduation.*

Grade Level: **9-12**

Major Concepts/Content

United States History (U.S. History) 9-12 Course – The grade 9-12 United States History course consists of the following content area strands: United States History, Geography, and Humanities. The primary content emphasis for this course pertains to the study of United States history from Reconstruction to the present day. Students will be exposed to the historical, geographic, political, economic, and sociological events which influenced the development of the United States and the resulting impact on world history. So that students can clearly see the relationship between cause and effect in historical events, students should have the opportunity to review those fundamental ideas and events which occurred before the end of Reconstruction.

Honors/Advanced courses offer scaffolded learning opportunities for students to develop the critical skills of analysis, synthesis, and evaluation in a more rigorous and reflective academic setting. Students are empowered to perform at higher levels as they engage in the following: analyzing historical documents and supplementary readings, working in the context of thematically categorized information, becoming proficient in note-taking, participating in Socratic seminars/discussions, emphasizing free-response and document-based writing, contrasting opposing viewpoints, solving problems, etc. Students will develop and demonstrate their skills through participation in a capstone and/or extended research-based paper/project (e.g., history fair, participatory citizenship project, mock congressional hearing, projects for competitive evaluation, investment portfolio contests, or other teacher-directed projects).

~~American History Honors will provide students with the opportunity to acquire an in depth and comprehensive understanding of the chronological development of the American people by examining the political, economic, social, religious, military, scientific, and cultural events that have affected the nation. Implicit in this is an understanding of the historical method, the inquiry process, historical reasoning and interpretation, and the issues of external and internal validity. Major Concepts/Content

Advanced Placement American History will provide students with the opportunity to develop the analytic skills and factual knowledge necessary to deal critically with the problems, content, and materials of American historic development. This is done by focusing on persistent themes and change in history and by applying historical reasoning to seek solutions to contemporary problems. Integral components of this course will include, but not be limited to, the formation of generalizations from primary sources in history, the synthesis and evaluation of information, the development of a set of criteria for judging proposed courses of action in terms of actual and projected consequences, the comparison of eras with similar trends, and analysis of the impact of major historical figures and groups on American and world events, the detection of bias in making conclusions, and the emergence of patterns in historical development. Reference will be made to the current advanced placement course description for American History published annually by the College Board. This course will prepare students for possible college credit. Students enrolled must take the AP exam. One credit of American history is required for graduation.

This course will prepare students for possible exemption of a college course.
