- ★ Student participation in CTE programs and the attainment of a recognized industry credential awarded through a third party assessment process will be one of the school's core indicators of success and included in the calculation of the school grade.
- The District will implement a Career and Technical Education 5 Year Strategic Plan that aligns with new federal and state requirements for students enrolled in career and technical education programs.
- Each high school will develop and implement an action plan to support the District Career and Technical Education 5 Year Strategic Plan.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO?

■ Each high school principal should meet with John Miracola, Director, Career, Technical and Adult/Community Education to develop the action plan for the school that aligns with the District's Career and Technical Education 5 Year Strategic Plan.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T?

★ Students will not have the opportunity to reach the CTE Concentrator level, which will negatively impact the school's ability to access federal funds through the Carl D. Perkins Act.
