HIGH SCHOOL TEXTBOOK ADOPTION: HAMPTON BROWN EDGE

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2008-2009?

- 9th and 10th grade high school Intensive Reading classes will be adopting the *Edge* program by Hampton-Brown.
- ♠ Placement for the 2008-2009 school year will be based on FCAT scores, oral reading fluency scores, and word list scores. Students will be placed via the new online student registration system.
- ★ The Edge Placement Test will be used as a baseline score for the 2008-2009 school year, and as part of the placement process for the 2009-2010 school year.
- ★ Wilson Reading will still be used with your most fragile readers reading at or below 3rd grade reading level.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO?

- ♠ Develop a plan for the administration of the program placement baseline tests to your Level 1 and 2 ninth and tenth graders, and for the administration of all required Intensive Reading assessments.
- ♠ Intensive Reading teachers should not be assigned to more than two levels (Wilson Reading, Edge A, B or C). Learning and preparing for more than one level of a new program is difficult and may lead to less intensity, fidelity of instruction and program implementation.
- All Level 1 and 2 Intensive Reading teachers must attend the Edge professional development in order to deliver instruction with fidelity. All high school reading coaches and support staff, including cNet coaches, should attend the Edge Coaching professional development.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T?

♠ Accurate placement of students is essential for fidelity of this program and to get positive results.
