

HIGH SCHOOL CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) INDUSTRY CREDENTIALS

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2009-2010?

- 🍏 The Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) has identified an Industry Credential Funding List, associated with CTE programs, as required in FS1003.43 and FS1003.492 to include an “industry-certified career education certification” designation on the standard high school diploma, indicating that the student “has attained marketable employment skills and is prepared to enter the work force.”
- 🍏 FS1008.34 stipulates that the school’s grade will be affected by the number of approved industry credentials awarded to students.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO?

- 🍏 Coordinate with the CTACE department who will provide curriculum, teacher training, and pre-assessment tests for students.
- 🍏 Notify CTE teachers, guidance staff and scheduling personnel so that they can assist students in preparation for acquiring industry credentials.
- 🍏 Ensure relevant students are appropriately pre-screened before certification exam (i.e. drug screen, background check).
- 🍏 Implement strategies to assure student attainment of industry credentials.
- 🍏 Report outcomes per directions provided by the CTACE department.
- 🍏 Discuss funding options of industry exams with the CTACE Director and/or other designated CTACE staff.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T?

- 🍏 School grade and funding may be negatively impacted.
- 🍏 Students will miss the opportunity to obtain an industry credential.

WHO NEEDS TO KNOW?

- 🍏 Principals, assistant principals, guidance staff, BRACE advisors, and CTE teachers.

HOW WILL YOU COMMUNICATE FOLLOW-UP?

- 🍏 An Industry Credential Database will be housed on the CTACE server. The CTACE Director will email principals with the appropriate link.
