MIDDLE SCHOOL CIVICS MANDATE

WHAT ELSE IS NEW FOR 2007-2008?

The new state social studies requirement (S. 1003.4156, F.S.) stipulates that students must complete three (3) middle school or higher year-long courses in social studies, one semester of which must include the study of state and federal government and civics education beginning with students entering grade 6 in 2006-2007. The mandate will be met by including the study of state and federal government and civics education in the current year-long eighth grade U.S. History course. Curriculum maps will be updated, lessons on BEEP will be adapted and/or added and a list of supplemental materials and/or Web sites will be provided to eighth grade U.S. history teachers to supplement the eighth grade U.S. history curriculum. Although eight grade curriculum will not change until 2008-2009, information will be rolled out to teachers during the 2007-2008 school year.
