SUMMER SES UNDER NCLB

WHAT'S NEW FOR THE SUMMER?

- This summer, eligible students attending Title I Schools that offer Supplemental Educational Services (SES) will have an opportunity to select a Summer SES program. Approved providers will offer the program.
- □ In the likely event that the private providers will be unable to serve all students, the State may release all withheld Title I funds so that the District may intercede and provide tutoring.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO?

- □ Title I Schools need to be aware of their eligible students and which providers will be delivering services. Title I schools should also poll their teachers to identify those interested in providing small group and individualized tutoring this summer for SES students.
- □ Work with providers to provide leases in a timely manner.
- □ If Set Aside funds are released, Title I Schools may be called upon to provide tutoring opportunities.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T?

□ Your students may miss out on receiving valuable tutoring as well as helping the District retrieve unspent set aside funding.

WHO NEEDS TO KNOW?

- □ Parents of eligible students
- Teachers interested in potential employment this summer (beyond the regular summer programs)

HOW WILL YOU COMMUNICATE FOLLOW-UP?

- □ The District will be notifying parents directly via U.S. mail to share Summer SES options.
- Additional copies of the letter, registration and provider information will be sent to principals along with a list of qualifying students at their schools.
- □ Principals should advise eligible parents to take advantage of Summer SES.
- □ Principals will submit a list of interested teachers to the Title I Office by May 1.
