

ALL RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION (RtI)

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2009-2010?

- Response to Intervention (RtI) is a Federal and State mandate. It is also a requirement on the Differentiated Accountability Crosswalk.
- RtI is an expansion of the Collaborative Problem Solving (CPS) model used by the District. RtI is implemented as a leveled or tiered approach to instructional delivery that includes interventions of increasingly higher intensity based a student's need.
- The District has drafted a 5-year Strategic Plan for RtI. Year 1 of the plan (2009-10) will focus on RtI training and preliminary implementation for all schools.
- Thirteen school psychologists and other district staff are attending a Department of Education train the trainer workshop August 11-13 in Palm Beach. These individuals will be the trainers for the district.
- Professional development for school teams will be delivered through Innovation Zones.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO?

- Identify school team for RtI to include the Principal, Assistant Principal, School Counselor, Math Coach, Reading Coach, teacher representative with expertise in 5 core content areas (English/language arts, math, reading, science, and social studies), Behavior Specialist, ESE Specialist, School Psychologist, School Social Worker.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU DON'T?

- School will be out of compliance with Federal law and Differentiated Accountability Crosswalk.
