WHAT IS NEW FOR 2010-2011?

★ Teachers will have the opportunity to receive FREE Advanced Placement (AP) training (with stipends) from The College Board during the week of Aug 2-6.

There are still a limited number of seats available in AP Music Theory, AP Computer Science A, AP Art History and AP Studio Art. AP trainings in these content areas will not be offered next year, therefore even potential AP teachers should be trained.

Though the registration deadline has passed, principals may still register teachers for these courses by contacting Joyce Greenberg via Cab.

- High school grades will reflect enrollment and performance in rigorous courses.
