



# AR Steps to Success!

- Student Reads a Book. Students choose books at their appropriate reading level from the Nob Hill Elementary Media Center, their local library, or other source and read them at their own pace.
- 2. Student Takes a Quiz. The Accelerated Reader program offers over 140,000 quizzes to help teachers motivate and monitor each student's reading performance and vocabulary growth.
- 3. **Teachers, Students, and Parents Get Information.** Teachers, Students, and Parents get immediate feedback on the reading and vocabulary growth of each student.
- 4. Students Work Towards Goals. Students work towards achieving reading goals set by their teachers and receive encouragement, awards, and acknowledgments.

Word Master: Take the vocabulary tests that go along with the AR tests Learn at least 10 new words.




Class Team: This award is a teamwork award. Encourage your classmates to hit their AR goals. Help them with their reading skills. To win this award 75% of the class must hit their AR goals.



Super Reader: Read, read, read. and make sure you take the AR tests carefully. Super Reader requirements are listed below.

# Super Reader Requirements

Achieve at least 5 AR points per Grade Level.

Pass Required Amount of AR Tests on Non-Fiction Books
(2 for 1st grade, 3 for 2nd grade, 3 for 3rd grade, 4 for 4th grade, 5 for 5th grade.)

Average 85% or higher on all AR tests taken.

Read books in your color range.

Remember, the requirement is 5 points per grade level and passing (not just taking the test, but scoring over 70%) the required amount of non-fiction per grade level. Required Non-Fiction is 2 books for 1st grade, 3 books for 2nd grade, 3 books for 3rd grade, 4 books for 4th grade, and 5 books for 5th grade. If a student chooses to read a longer Non-Fiction book, each point that the book is worth will count for 1 book. So a Non-fiction book that is worth 3 AR points would count as 3 books. So, a student in 3rd grade would need to achieve at least 15 points (5 points x 3rd grade, 5 x 3 = 15) and at least 3 points would need to be from non-fiction (1 point x 3rd grade, 1 x 3 = 3). Students are, of course, invited score more total points or more points of non-fiction.
