This year PASL will focus on a **select group of ninth grade students**. The goal is to eventually reach all of 9th grade and beyond.



Your Student ID: Also known as your FSI# (Florida Student ID number). This number is printed on the student schedule. If you do not know this number, you may contact any one of your teachers for it.

The Pin Code:

The student's date of birth typed as YYYYMMDD: Four digits for year, two digits for month, and two digits for day. NO: spaces, lashes, dashes, or commas. EX: This student's birthday is June 25, 1989 would be typed in as 19890625.

Identification Badges

Identification badges must be worn at all times by students, faculty and staff while on campus.

Additionally, individuals visiting campus must wear some form of identification (district- issued identification badge or site-based generated visitor or volunteer badge) while on campus. Upon entry to campus, all visitors must be processed through the STAR System.

Security Tracking and Response (STAR) System:

This includes, but is not limited to, parents, District staff, vendors, volunteers, and members of the public. If the STAR System is temporarily inoperable, you will be directed to follow a manual sign-in and out process. An official photo identification will be requested. Your name, date of visit, time of arrival, purpose for visit and time of departure will be reported in a visitor's log.

After School Activities

We offer several programs and activities that are beyond the regular school day. Students must



remain with the adults in charge while on campus. Students who are not involved in approved before and after school programs/activities must exit the campus if they are not supervised. Please ensure that you have a process in place for your child to exit our campus by 3:10pm if not in a supervised activity.

Emergency Drills

Emergency preparedness and response drills/training will continue to occur on a regular basis. This includes fire drills, tornado drills and critical incident drills. Appropriate notice of the drills will be sent to essential stakeholders. We will conduct a Code Red Drill within the first two weeks of school and one each month thereafter.
