Coral Park Elementary is located in Coral Springs, Florida. The neighborhood consists of single-family estate homes, villas, and some Section 8 apartments. When the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) and school grades was implemented, Coral Park rated as an "A" until 2010-2011 at which time it dropped to a "B". In 2011-2012, the school regained the "A" status, but dropped to a "B" in the 2012-2013 school year, then to a "C" in 2013-2014, and earned a "B" for the 2014-2015 school year. As a result of the hard work of our staff and students, Coral Park earned a "B". For the years 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, Coral Park Elementary earned a school grade of a "B". Below are breakdowns of the demographics of Coral Park's 610 students and the community's population of 126,264. Approximately 473 students served are from the local neighborhood. The additional 137 students attend Coral Park Elementary through the district's reassignment plan.

Coral Park Elementary supports the whole child through guidance lessons to develop study skills, social skills and positive character traits. In addition, the school has implemented the "How Full is Your Bucket" program school-wide and "Positive Behavior Referrals". These programs focus on positive behaviors such as being responsible, caring and kind. Furthermore, the school provides informational sessions for families regarding academic content, effective study skills and positive behavior through our "Parent Universities". In an effort to increase communication and transparency, Ms. Pontillo hosts "Principal Chats" for the families of our students. Through the School Advisory Council, Coral Park continues to inform, encourage and provide opportunities for parents and community members to be involved in the planning and evaluation of the school's instructional program and quality improvement processes. The teachers and support staff at this school participate in a collaborative process in grade level teams to pace the instructional focus based on the Florida State Standards, develop common assessments to determine mastery of each standard, identify students needing remediation or enrichment, and share best practices.

Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement

Coral Park Elementary is also the home for a special needs program to 45 students with the support of an autism coach. The coach began "Play Pals", an innovative program recognized by the school district. This program pairs general education students with specials needs students providing opportunities to form relationships and reduce their isolation, as well as, leadership and acceptance of others.

At Coral Park, we continually seek to integrate technology into our teaching and learning. Coral Park is proud to have Digital 3, 4, and 5 classrooms. This digital program provides a one-to-one computer to student ratio in grades 3 through 5, along with the tools to create an engaging personalized learning environment for our students.

Thanks to the generous support of our Parent Teacher Association (PTA), each classroom is equipped with LCD projectors, document cameras, and interactive Promethean boards, all used to present to our 21st century, technology savvy students. PTA has also provided Coral Park with an updated technology Lab where students can work on project-based learning, coding, and learning system programs. Every student has an i-Ready Reading and Math account to meet their individualized learning needs. Through our active PTA and caring community, Coral Park promotes community and service project involvement. We participate in annual food, clothing, toy, and animal shelter need drives to support the needs of our community.

Coral Park has created their very own vegetable garden that is grant funded through one of our teachers. Here our students and teachers collaborate with community gardening experts to grow our own vegetables and herbs. This has been an amazing and fun way to integrate reading, writing, math, science, and social studies as the students experience the gardening process from the seeds to harvesting to eating!

Over the last few years, Coral Park has focused on standards driven planning, student data analysis, and identifying common assessments to determine mastery of the standards. We will continue to improve this process by unwrapping the standards in the content areas. In addition, faculty will be participating in professional learning to increase their knowledge of how to analyze student data to inform instruction. Finally, teachers and support staff will collaborate to identify and develop common assessments to appropriately measure understanding of the standards within the test specifications.

A barrier to developing mathematics concepts has been the lack of fluency with addition and/or multiplication facts. In order to remove the barrier and meet the fluency standards for each grade level, Coral Park Elementary implemented a deliberate practice to develop addition and multiplication concepts, then provide the tools for students to practice the facts to reach automaticity. The school's data indicates that approximately 49% of the students had mastered their grade level facts at the end of the 2017-2018 school year.
