#### General Obligation (SMART) Bond – Passed November 4, 2014

\* The Safety, Music & Art, Athletics, Renovations, and Technology (SMART) referendum will provide \$800 million dollars to Broward County Schools over the next five years.

\* Riverland Elementary School will receive \$1.95 million for in-progress and planned projects.

\* Riverland Elementary School is presently working to spend the \$100,000 available through School Choice Enhancement Program portion of the SMART Bond.
