MINUTES

South Broward High School School Advisory Council (SAC)

Date: April 29, 2019 Regular Meeting #7 2018-2019

The SAC meeting was called to order by Mr. Consbruck at 3:02pm at South Broward High School in the Media Center.

I. Approval of Minutes

Mr. Consbruck asked the committee to review the March 18, 2019 minutes. Mrs. Feldman motioned to accept the minutes. Mr. Rodriguez seconded the motion. The motion approved unanimously.

II. Principal's Report

Mrs. Brown gave the Principals report:

She began by thanking everyone for attending, especially Mrs. Grampa who was responsible for the food. Mrs. Brown informed us that our athletic teams are doing well, with the girls water polo and boys volleyball competing for a state championship May 10. The boys track 4x4 will be running for the state championship this weekend.

On May 9th Mrs. Babok will be recognized at Bailey Hall for being volunteer of the year. May 8th will be our Senior Awards Night, April 30th are the Honor Society Inductions, and on May 3 is the SVE end of year banquet at the Anne Kolb Center.

Mrs. Brown also informed everyone about a situation today where a man was immediately spotted jumping a fence onto school grounds. Security and SRO confronted the man instantly and arrested him. She gave a reminder that we are constantly watching and securing our campus.

III. School Improvement Plan Monitoring

- a. **2019-2020 Positive Behavior Plan Voting Results-** 86% staff voted in favor and 14% were not in favor. The plan passed. Out of 113 eligible voters: 97 voted for and 4 voted against the plan.
- b. **2019-2020 Exam Exemption Wavier Voting Results-** 77% of staff were in favor 22% were not in favor. The exemption passed.

IV. Accreditation Monitoring

a. **SMART Update-** The single point entrance/ front office is still under construction. Progress can be seen as new fences are up. We are still projecting to finish by the start of next school year.

V. New Business

- a. 21st Century- Mrs. Chaplin- The 21st Century Program will have the theme of "express yourself" this summer. It is the hope to have a showcase to conclude the summer to show the variety of enrichment taught throughout the summer program. Edmentum will also continue over the summer to help students gain necessary credits to graduate. We are still planning field trips, many are planned by the district. - b. Training- Trending Topics- E-Cigarette use amongst High Schoolers- Mrs. Itzkowitz informed everyone she wished to open a dialogue about the vaping/e-cigarette trend to make parents more aware of this trend. Expressing that they come in many different forms and various sizes. They are filled with oils that are sold over the counter.

The newest brand is the JUUL, it looks like a flash drive, it is rechargeable, has 20 times the nicotine than cigarettes, and comes in various flavors. It is hard to detect because it is rather odorless and small. The long-term impacts are mostly unknown. The PAX utilizes marijuana oil which would count as a felony for possession, this is also odorless. There is also a disposable form which is a STIG, and they are cheap and easy to access. The discipline for use of these items in school is a 10-day suspension, possible expulsion, and arrest. Mrs. Brown added that at a Principals meeting they spoke of tobacco companies being good at marketing and their sales. She stressed that these items are heavily marketed to youths. She also noted that clothing is being adapted to include these vaporizers. The floor was open for questions.

A parent asked, "Are students told of the impacts and the discipline of this?"

Mrs. Itzkowitz informed the parent they have been informed several times at positive behavior assemblies and even during Mrs. Brown's introductory meetings with the students.

c. iCan – Mr. O'Toole states iCan will be part of our magnet program that will allow us to bring in students from anywhere south of 595. iCan will allow students to join an "academy" which will gear students to enroll in classes that they are interested in. Project Based Learning will aid SBHS ensure students are attaining an industry certification or college credits. Mr. O'Toole informed every that the next steps are: communicating the vision, training staff, sharing successes, networking with feeder schools, and creating community stakeholders.
