Curriculum Update	Kamara Sanon
Literacy – Administration is working closely with our reading teachers. This year, the English and reading teachers are physically near each other with common planning periods and PLC meetings on Wednesdays to ensure that everyone is on the same page, supporting students in both classes. We are currently focusing on receiving a message from more than one medium. This is what we've been working on, and we assess students on a 1-4 scale, with 4 meaning mastery. For writing, we are working on district writing prompts for 9-10 grade students. Grade 11-12 are working on scholarship essays. Reading teachers are supporting upper classmen with reading strategies for SAT and ACT.	
Biology – Stranahan students completed photosynthesis and moving mitosis; Instructional Facilitator visited to give feedback on instructional strategies	
Math – In core math classes, students are studying inequalities and finding the midpoint in preparation for their EOC	
January-Stomp the SAT through the reading and English classes; March 7 <sup>th</sup> for the SAT in the district-all juniors will take the SAT for free; 56 seniors who have not yet the ELA requirement; starts in January; review of reading strategies	
Attack the ACT in preparation for the April test in an effort to ensure that the seniors are graduation ready.	

January 10<sup>th</sup>-PERT Day 14th seniors not yet graduation ready; review test-taking strategies; and take the PERT after lunch (30 questions) which is equivalent to the Algebra EOC; attempting to eliminate the ACT which makes is harder to graduate House Bill 7069 SAT: 430 potentially increased to 500 in the near future; ACT: ; take the PERT to avoid having to take these assessments at a more difficult; students are able to use their cellular; Sprint Million Project-if in need who do not have internet readily available at home of a cell phone from Sprint; Sanon clarified that reading is considered an elective not a requirement

Bass solicited participants to join SAC; Sanon addressed the need for 51% to conduct; we're in need of student vouchers to pay for the ACT and SAT for those students who may not be eligible for F & R lunch and still can't afford to pay for the tests
