Croissant Fark Elementary SAC minutes: 10/24/18

- Welcome and Introduction: Regina Steinbeck called the meeting to order at 7:30am
- Approval of Minutes: Ms. Laing motioned to approve minutes from previous meeting held on 9/12/18.
 Ms. Leville seconded the motion. Minutes were passed. Leachelle Moton was introduced as the ASP Community Representative.
- Social Emotional Learning Plan: Lucy Dorlus provided forms highlighting goals and objectives/strategies on
 how we can implement Social Emotional Learning schoolwide. Goal 1: Develop self-awareness and management
 skills to achieve school and life success. Goal 2: Use social-awareness and interpersonal skills to establish and
 maintain positive relationships. Goal 3: Demonstrate decision-making skills and responsible behaviors in
 personal, school and community contexts. (Examples include: Mindful Mondays. introducing Yoga, multicultural awareness, peer counselors, TRIBES, distribution of books to all teachers).

Tier 1- ALL Students. Tier 2- SOME Students. Tier 3- FEW Students.

• SAC By-Laws Review: The objective was described- plans reviewed for school, Crusader Committees, monitor and implement School Improvement Flan (SIP), parent/teacher survey, budget approval/denial, vote on members from faculty and community members. It should be noted, committee struggles to find specific people to fill roles. The By-Laws are available in the office for the committee to view.

• Principal's Report:

- Vision Statement: "To be a school with highly effective instructional practices that fuel a growth mindset among all learners" Vote by show of hands to approve vision statement= majority rule=100%. Vision statement passed.
- After school camps are planned a will be 2 days a week from 2:30pm-3:30pm. Options include: Science, Writing, ELA and Math. These camps are funded through Title 1 Funds. Croissant Park Elementary stands with 89% students on free/reduced lunch. Started in October, ASP and FLASH now serve dinner (approximately 177 dinners)
- Discussed at previous principal zone meeting- Only 40% of Croissant Park Elementary graduates matriculate to New River Middle. They are looking to see how to make New River Middle more appealing. They are missing the connection piece from Croissant Park Elementary to New River Middle to Stranahan High School. Ideas came to 'bring students to the middle/high school for shows/events' to have them see and experience the school rather than have the middle and high school students come to Croissant Park Elementary.
- Croissant Park Elementary has been approved for a buzzer system at front door. SMART funds- we are up. Ms. Allison is able to find funds in budget. Project/construction/implementation has been approved by school board for remodel. Scanner vs. buzzer. Scanner was \$5,000 (too much). Buzzer will have a camera.
- Fall Festival/Book Fair: this Friday 10/26 6:00pm-8:00pm.
