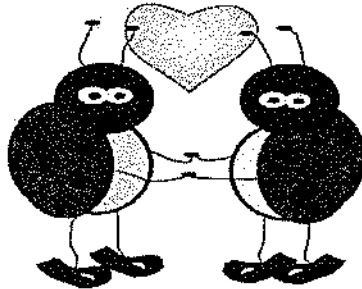

Welcome and Introduction: Regina Steinbeck called the meeting to order at 7:30am

Approval of Minutes: Ms. Mianowski motioned to approve minutes from previous meeting held on 1/16/18. Ms. Laing seconded the motion. Minutes were passed.

BOND process: SAC input/school improvement- Faculty given a list to rate 1-8 options that they feel are important to them. Regina asked committee what specific items are important to school that have a 5 year shelf life. The committee discussed that all options will be now need to be priced. 3 vendors are used for the county. Ms. Allison will need to assess how much each option will cost. (ex. teacher chair = \$300. blinds = vendors coming in and assessing). It will be determined if slates can be replaced or is it up to code. County has select vendors. Additional items have been added to list for faculty including prices for faculty to review.

Principal's Report: Data- required to meet monthly to review data. A 3-year composite data colored chart for grades 3-5 was given out to committee. Scores received from state. 3rd- ELA and Math, 4th- ELA and Math, 5th- ELA, Math and Science. Writing score for 4th and 5th- 1/16 of score- not as much emphasis. 3rd- FSA (Florida Standards Assessment) sitting to take assessment first. It is less than a month away. Students asked to complete over 2 days. If a 3rd grade student does not pass the FSA an alternate assessment is given. Keystone is an alternate exam- utilized for promotion criteria. Other assessments include: End of Year Assessment/SAT 10. If not, then the student can attend summer school. If the 3rd grade student has not met the promotion criteria, then student is given an exam near the beginning of the next school year where they can be promoted to 4th if they pass that last exam. Free/Reduced lunch students are 92% of school population. Monitor lowest 25%. Those students are monitored and documented by the state.

Goal for school year- Get to a B. If we can get all scores to average 62 you are an A school, if we can get all scores to average 53 and above you are a B school. ACCESS assessment is completed for 253 ESOL students. ACCESS testing assesses Speaking, Writing and Listening for ESOL students. This assessment is used to monitor these students. Small groups and camps (ELL/ESOL) 2x a week are being offered. All students are not counted on school grade for 1st 2 years, but if came in March and sat for FSA – their scores report for school. If sat exam and come back again to sit it then scores do count toward school. Cross reference who sat FSA who are ELL. ESE kids testing is dictated on what is stated in their IEP's. Must follow accommodations for assessments. ESE students do count even on alternative assessment. High population of ESE students.
