

Broward District Advisory Council Make-up Work & Homework Subcommittee ~Final Recommendations~ Tuesday, January 15th 2019

1. Make-up Work for ALL absences - Current Policy

Make-up is allowed for full credit and grade for excused and unexcused absences. (Elem & Middle)
Make-up is allowed for full credit and grade for excused absences. (High & HS courses in Middle)

Recommendation - Replace "is allowed" with "shall be allowed" in ALL references to make-up work for Elem., Middle & High in Policy 6000.1

2. Make-up Work for Unexcused absences: 6/16-current (High School & Middle School Students taking HS classes)

- (1) Make-up work is allowed for full credit and grade for excused absences.
- (2) Make-up work **is allowed** for unexcused absences. Teachers **may**, at their **discretion**, record a 10% reduction in the grade for tests and major projects that meet standards or proficiency. Teachers **may also**, at their **discretion**, record the lowest passing grade (D or 60%) for homework, unless less than 50% of the work was successfully completed.
- (3) All make-up work must be submitted within two days, not including the day of return, for each day of an absence. Previously assigned work is due the day of return. Under extenuating circumstances and at a teacher's discretion, additional time may be allowed.

Recommendation – All students shall be given an opportunity to make up work for full-earned credit and grade for ALL absences and field trips. Make-up work must be submitted within two days, not including the day of return, for each day of an absence. Previously assigned work is due the day of return. Under extenuating circumstances and at teacher's discretion, additional time may be allowed.

(Palm Beach, Duval & Orange County allow make-up work for unexcused absences w/o academic penalty)

Rationale:

BCPS's Mission Statement - "Committed to educating ALL students to reach their highest potential"

- a.) Behavioral solutions, not academic consequences, should be used to address habitual absences or cutting class.
- **b.)** Students should not incur academic consequences as a result of their parent's lack of involvement in their child's education and their inability or refusal to call in the absence.
- c.) Reasons that parents do NOT call in their child's absence: Language barrier, immigrant parents may be unfamiliar with how the U.S. school system works, they don't know that they need to call, don't know where to find the rules on parent's responsibilities and consequences, addiction, parent illness, they don't have their student's ID #, they forget, they are working 2-3 jobs, parental neglect, no phone, parent's expectations that their teen student manage school responsibilities on their own in high school.
- d.) The school's hotline must record 100% of the calls accurately. Can this be assured?
- **e.)** There is too much room for human error and many callers are not clear, call reception is bad or all of the required information is not provided or captured.
- f.) The student's grades can be negatively affected as a result of human error.
