- IV. Principal's Report- Mr. LaPace (Principal)
 - o Cambridge Program Application started for McArthur High School
 1. Students receive Bright Futures Scholarship money once the class is completed with a qualifying score on the Cambridge Subject Exam
 2. Students also get college credit similar to Advanced Placement classes
 3. Students can come from out of area to our school for the Cambridge Program
 - Band on the 14th of December are having a holiday trip
 - Exam week: 18th of December to the 21st (Tuesday to Friday)
- V. Committee Reports:
 - SVE: No report
 - 9th and 10th --- Critical Thinking continues to emphasize skill sets and ELA continues to emphasize writing through literature and informational text. 9th and 10th grade ELA and Critical Thinking classes are continuing to work together to form a cohesive team.

These assessments involved the standards from the Craft & Structure and Integration of Knowledge domains through our CARE plan and IFC.

11th and 12th --- English IV retakes (for the most part) took the SAT on Saturday morning.

Retake classes are now switching over to emphasis on the ACT. The skills and strategies taught translate for either test. After Christmas break, we will gear up again for the in-school March SAT.

For both 11th and 12th, the common assessment was and is being administered last week and this so we will have data from that by next week for the principal's data chat on 12/10.

12th grade has completed "Hamlet" and is moving on to a non fiction passage. "The Transmission of Violence" this will take us to the end of the semester.

11th grade is wrapping up foundational documents, The Constitution and a piece on Jefferson. They are also working on the informative essay.

On Thursday, December 6th, we are having a department meeting. Mid-term exams and IFCs for next semester will be finalized.

Social Studies:

1. Teachers will be finishing up the second quarter and prepping for midterms.
2. AP teachers will be assessing and contacting parents for conferences and or adjusting class curriculum.
3. We are implementing Naviance as a tool for career planning department wide.
4. Benchmark assessments for US History will take place January 8-11th. (This is a practice EOC)
5. We hope everyone have a safe and enjoyable holiday and all the best for 2019.

Math: Students have finished Unit four and are working on reviewing the midterm. Midterm will be a review of all standards taught. YMCA is still in full effect and PERT testing will be given to our Seniors the week of midterms.

Biology: Students are currently studying plant and animal cell structure

- All Teachers will have a data chat folder for each student in their classes.
- Provide interventions such as after-school tutoring (YMCA)
- Special attention/emphasis this year will be placed on the Regular Biology students to increase scores
- Incentive programs and relationship building will be established.
