Article V.1. The District shall provide that students at each school shall be dismissed two hours early on six days during the school year. Any school may opt-out of providing early release time by 66 2/3 percent vote of bargaining unit members through the waiver methodology described in Contract Article 15.

8. State the waiver: change, delete, or add to the policy or contract so as to fulfill the requirements of the proposed waiver.

In addition to the six early release days currently scheduled, the District shall provide that students at McArthur High School shall be dismissed three hours early for eight additional days during the school year for the purpose of High School Reform. The We are requesting this waiver be approved for 5 years. The school will analyze the data each year to determine whether to continue the waiver as is, adjust the number of days requested, or discontinue the waiver.

State the rationale for the proposed waiver. How will the proposed waiver support school improvement? Give background information, history of barrier, etc.

After planning days, McArthur High School will have a maximum of eight hours for professional development on early release days and planning days in the 2019-2020. school year. That is less than one hour per month for the remainder of the school year. Most of the allocated time during planning days will be spent on District initiatives, including Florida Standards Based Instruction, Marzano's Legacy Model, and FEAP's. The rest of the allocated time will also be used for school-wide initiatives including: Mathematics, College Readiness, Reading, data analysis, common formative assessments, Instructional Focus Calendar, Naviance and Canvas platforms. Additional time is needed to empower educators to develop plans for their own improvements through professional learning communities that will lead to increased student achievement. The waiver will provide teachers with the time to learn to use creative and engaging classroom practices with fidelity. The eight additional days will help us align staff development and provide every department the necessary time to pursue professional learning goals through continuous improvement.

 Recognizing that one strategy alone does not affect school-wide achievement, identify and explain the baseline data for the proposed waiver.

Our accreditation survey results pertaining to Standard 3: Teaching and Assessing for Learning; which focuses on the school's curriculum, instructional design, and assessment practices guide and ensure teacher effectiveness and student learning resulted in a baseline of 3.71 parent satisfaction rating compared to the Districts overall result of 4.08, A 3.48 student satisfaction rating compared to the Districts overall result of 4.06. Lastly, a 3.88 staff satisfaction rating compared to the Districts overall result of 4.08.

11. What reliable research studies, proven strategies, best practices, or similar programs support the probable success of the proposed waiver?

PLCs use data to determine student and educator learning needs; develop common team goals; engage in learning to implement research-based strategies and use formative and summative data to evaluate the impact of what was learned and implemented. A

goal of Broward's BEST (Beyond Expected Student Targets) initiative is to establish and ensure authentic PLCs in all assessed grades/subjects incorporating CARE (Curriculum, Assessment, Remediation and Enrichment) Cycles in order provide further structure of the work of PLCs by guiding team conversations and plans for learning in Curriculum, Assessment, Remediation and Enrichment.



VI. Committee Reports

a. Reading and Writing

- i. Both grades have entered our "second" crunch time for retakes. FSA will be administered the last week of February and the in-house SAT will be administered on March 6th. All juniors and those seniors who still need a qualifying exam will be signed up for the SAT. There is a time accommodation for ELL students; Ms. Pierre and Ms. Bembanaste are working on having our seniors signed up for this accommodation. Both Critical Thinking and English classes are emphasizing SAT practice. Critical Thinking focuses on comprehension while English pinpoints grammar skills.
- ii. There is an opportunity for students to receive a concordant score (430) which is derived from the average of reading and Writing & Language scores to substitute for the FSA. This addition of W & L pushes some of our students over the hump hooray.
- iii. We are down to approximately 50 seniors who still require a qualifying exam.
- iv. Both 11th and 12th grade are working on an argumentative research paper this quarter.
- v. There is an opportunity for students to receive a concordant score (430) which is derived from the average of reading and Writing & Language scores to substitute for the FSA. This addition of W & L pushes some of our students over the hump.

b. Mathematics

- i. Algebra 1 and Geometry are currently in their 6 Unit with only two units left.
- ii. Algebra 1 began their pull out program targeting level one students.
- iii. Geometry will begin their pull out program in February.
- iv. Mustang camp details will be finalized in the next week to give our students four Saturday's of review.
- v. Seniors were administrated the PERT exam on January 24th and we are down to 19 seniors left to meet the Algebra 1 requirements.
- vi. Juniors and Seniors will be tested again in PERT on February 21 which is an early release.
- vii. YMCA tutoring is still going strong for both Algebra and Geometry help.
- viii. We are officially 13 weeks away until the EOC exams.

c. Social Studies

- i. Social Studies classes will be assigning their Black History Month projects in all classes.
- ii. Students will continue to be exposed to the benefits of Naviance.
- U.S History teachers are working towards the EOC and using the BSA results to guide instructions.
- iv. A number of US History classes did an amazing activity where they reenacted life during the 1920's.
- v. AP teachers are working towards preparing students for the exams in May.



SVE: English fact and opinion and writing Book Reports

9th and 10th --- Critical Thinking continues to emphasize skill sets and ELA continues to emphasize writing through literature and informational text. 9th and 10th grade ELA and Critical Thinking classes are continuing to work together to form a cohesive team. These assessments involved the standards from the Craft & Structure and Integration of Knowledge domains through our CARE plan and IFC.

11th & 12th ELA

Both grades have entered our "second" crunch time for retakes. FSA will be administered the last week of February and the in-house SAT will be administered on March 6th. All juniors and those seniors who still need a qualifying exam will be signed up for the SAT. There is a time accommodation for ELL students; Ms. Pierre and Ms. Bembanaste are working on having our seniors signed up for this. Both Critical Thinking and English classes are emphasizing SAT practice. Critical Thinking focuses on comprehension while English pinpoints grammar skills.

There is an opportunity for students to receive a concordant score (430) which is derived from the average of reading and Writing & Language scores to substitute for the FSA. This addition of W & L pushes some of our students over the hump.

Math:

Mustang Academy begins in April. We have only 21 Seniors left to test Algebra I EOC. YMCA still going strong on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We no longer have the PERT test. PSAT/SAT standards bridged to Algebra 1.

Social Studies:

- 1. US history will continue to focus on EOC preparation. Tutoring and after school sessions will be available leading up to the exam.
- BSA (benchmark assessment results will be available in about 2 weeks)
- 2. All Social Studies classes will be assigning a Black History Month project for next month.
- 3. AP teachers are focused on the exams in May.
