- IV. Principal's Report David Piroozhad
 - a. Day of Love February 14, 2019 Stoneman Douglas required no mail or gifts sent to the high school. Stoneman Douglas has a day off only school in Broward.
 - b. Students at McArthur are doing individual displays of affection throughout our community- different clubs and organizations.
 - c. Courtyard celebrating Valentine's Day (Cards during lunch, courtyard decorations... etc.)
 - d. Saturday Camp FSA/SAT Prep
 - e. Bisset AP Class Exam Reviews
 - f. Chorus Concert Feb. 12, 2019
 - g. February 14th & 15th no activities will be held. No activities on these days
- V. Student Tracking System "HERO"- \$6,000 purchase- James Elder
 - a. Current camera software on campus is out of date. (Doesn't communicate with Pinnacle and does not provide live updates. Can possibly be a security risk if not updated)
 - b. Purchasing new system (HERO) would provide the following:
 - i. Provide a simple way to consistently reinforce the good, school-wide
 - ii. Visualize data to proactively monitor trends
 - iii. Maintain data accuracy with the SIS data transfers
 - iv. Compliance module holds students accountable for their consequences

- v. Reporting gives you the data you need to drive the right decisions and workflows
- vi. Optimize behavior management through streamlined, automated, customized end-to-end process
- vii. Motion to purchase HERO by Laura Marsh (Gifted Rep) & seconded by Janet Bravo (Parent)
- viii. SAC voted in favor of purchase.

VI. Committee Reports

a. Reading and Writing

- i. Both grades have entered our "second" crunch time for retakes. FSA will be administered the last week of February and the in-house SAT will be administered on March 6th. All juniors and those seniors who still need a qualifying exam will be signed up for the SAT. There is a time accommodation for ELL students; Ms. Pierre and Ms. Bembanaste are working on having our seniors signed up for this accommodation. Both Critical Thinking and English classes are emphasizing SAT practice. Critical Thinking focuses on comprehension while English pinpoints grammar skills.
- ii. There is an opportunity for students to receive a concordant score (430) which is derived from the average of reading and Writing & Language scores to substitute for the FSA. This addition of W & L pushes some of our students over the hump hooray.
- iii. We are down to approximately 50 seniors who still require a qualifying exam.
- iv. Both 11th and 12th grade are working on an argumentative research paper this quarter.
- v. There is an opportunity for students to receive a concordant score (430) which is derived from the average of reading and Writing & Language scores to substitute for the FSA. This addition of W & L pushes some of our students over the hump.

b. Mathematics

- i. Algebra 1 and Geometry are currently in their 6 Unit with only two units left.
- ii. Algebra 1 began their pull out program targeting level one students.
- iii. Geometry will begin their pull out program in February.
- iv. Mustang camp details will be finalized in the next week to give our students four Saturday's of review.
- v. Seniors were administrated the PERT exam on January 24th and we are down to 19 seniors left to meet the Algebra 1 requirements.
- vi. Juniors and Seniors will be tested again in PERT on February 21 which is an early release.
- vii. YMCA tutoring is still going strong for both Algebra and Geometry help.
- viii. We are officially 13 weeks away until the EOC exams.

c. Social Studies

- Social Studies classes will be assigning their Black History Month projects in all classes.
- ii. Students will continue to be exposed to the benefits of Naviance.
- iii. U.S History teachers are working towards the EOC and using the BSA results to guide instructions.
- iv. A number of US History classes did an amazing activity where they reenacted life during the 1920's.
- v. AP teachers are working towards preparing students for the exams in May.
- vi. World history classes will be focusing on the Industrial Revolution

d. Testing

- i. February 26, 2019 begins FSA Retakes Testing
- ii. March 6, 2019 In-House SAT for Juniors and Seniors
- iii. February 21, 2019 Pert Testing

e. ESE/SVE

- i. This past Friday our students had a super bowl chili cook off.
- ii. Our SVE students will be participating in the live museum for black history month.
- iii. our students in horticulture will be attending a college field trip.
- iv. Two innovative additions into our self- determination and study hall classes, 1. Coding 2. Mindfulness with chess.
- v. In April we will be attending the spring special Olympics
- vi. Leadership team has begun to organize the structure of classes for next year to better serve our students. We are working diligently to determine the absolute best placements in their classes, gen ed, and electives though their IEP, current performance and personal preferences.
- vii. As always, our bi weekly agenda is sent out every other Friday including all campus activities as well as a daily home note communicating pertinent information.


