IV. Principal's Report-Mr. LaPace

- a. There are so many positive things happening on our school's campus. Our wall of recognition that starts blank every year is not completely full. Our students are doing amazing things and continuing to win awards and gaining recognition.
- We are gearing up for graduation and reflecting on this past year. I am starting to plan for next year to continue to improve for the school and our students.
- c. My Next Move is proceeding with 100 students that were identified as not going to college will be participating in a job fair for students with great companies around the area. These students have been given one on one help with resume building and interviewing to help them succeeded.

V. Committee Reports

a. Reading and Writing-The ELA department is in a holding pattern waiting for scores including ACT, and FSA. The SAT was held this past Saturday with only twenty one seniors left that need the Reading requirement to to graduate. There will be a test available in June for those students who did not meet the requirement with the last FSA

- or SAT scores. There are only 13 days left for seniors and all 9th and 10th grade students recently took their FSA Reading portion of their exam.
- b. Math-Beckford-Summary- The PERT exam will be given on Tuesday May 8th will only eight seniors left that need to pass the PERT to meet their Algebra graduation requirement. This is our lowest numbers ever. Algebra and Geometry just recently took their FSA Exams with having over 96% of the students present.
- c. Science- The last Biology Saturday tutor session took place on May 5th, with the number of students in attendance was strong with great engagement. The Science Biology EOC exam is tomorrow May 8th with the school being on a modified bell schedule to ensure students are given enough time to test. The YMCA is still assisting students in credit recovery for science and getting ready for final exams.
- d. Social Studies-The first day of AP testing began today May 7th with the first exam being Psychology and will end with AP Human Geography on May 18. There was a US History review with over 150 students in attendance before their EOC Exams. The final day for Makeup History Exam will be tomorrow May 8th during the Biology EOC.
- e. Testing -Tomorrow is last and final day of regular scheduled EOC EXAMs. We will be working to get people in for Makeup exams as needed. Testing has gone smooth will all test meeting and exceeding the minimum of 95% of students in attendance. AP testing is in full swing with the last AP exam taking place on May 18. There are no make ups for AP Exams.
- VI. EdCite Is a program that we use every year in the Math department. This site allows students to practice on a platform like the FSA to prepare for their EOC exams. Asking SAC to approve a budget of \$6500 to purchase the EdCite program for the 218-2019 school year.

- c. Del a Cruz reviewed the PASAL/ Soar program with is for students that have a GPA of 2.0 or less and/or students with excessive unexcused absences.
- d. Girls Track has a freshman that is currently ranked 13th in the state in the 400.
- e. Band update: Ban competed in the state competition with students getting a chance to experience Bush Gardens and Disney worlds.
