Blanche Ely High School SAF/SAC Minutes -December 18, 2018.

Call to Order:

A meeting of the Blanche Ely High School Advisory Council was held in the Amphitheater December 18th. Mr. Spence called the meeting to order at 6:43. Steven Woloszn will record minutes for this meeting.

Minutes:

SAC Meeting Minutes 12/18/18

- Mr. Spence called the meeting to order at 6:43. Members reviewed the meeting minutes from November. Ms. Blands requested that since there are two Mr. Kings, their first initials will be used in minutes. Ms. Robinson motioned to accept the minutes w/ the corrections. Ms. Blands seconded. A vote of Aye carried the minutes.
- Mr. Spence shared a SMART update. We do not have to go to a vote for the additional laptops installed in the existing carts. He will have a timeline for those laptops to be set up in the four carts at the next meeting.
- > He is also working on getting a quote on purchasing 500 lanyards to sell to students. Those students who are new will receive theirs at no charge.
- Ms. Blands inquired about those students who need new IDs and lanyards. Mr. Spence informed the group that the cost would be \$5, \$2 for the ID and \$3 for the lanyard.
- > Ms. Fields asked whether this will be an adequate supply of lanyards needed. Mr. Spence said that this will be enough for the number of freshman we have and new students.
- > School Improvement Plan: Mr. Spence attended a meeting Wednesday. He and Dr. Clark will be working on a section over winter break. One area that is being focused on is Community Involvement.
- For SAC, we still need involvement from three areas: ESE, ESOL, and Gifted need representation. These members have to be parents of students.
- Mr. D. King asked if what is in the Guidance area of the SIP is being done. He shared what is stated in the SIP as far as various activities that are taking place. Counselors are visiting w/students to go over expectations and such.

- > Ms. Walker said that since Dr. Johnson is here, anyone who has a question to ask needs to do so. She asked him about seeing a copy of the budget. He said that he would be glad to share that. As follow-up he will provide copies of the budget to the co-chairs.
- > Ms. Robinson asked why the two budgets weren't on the agenda. Mr. Spence informed the group that the budget hasn't changed since it was shared last.
- > Ms. Walker expressed concern that community members go downtown to push for what the school needs. Two issues that need addressed (more funds) are Security and the covering for the bus ramp area.
- > Ms. Wade-Lester noted in November's minutes that Mr. Spence mentioned to the group that the budget is not public knowledge. There is a bit of uncertainty about this. Dr. Johnson informed the group that he will be glad to share the budget w/ the group.
- > Dr. Johnson and Mr. D. King left the meeting to look up a copy of the budget from email.
- > Ms. Robinson shared that she appreciates the work the chairs are doing in pushing for things for the school at School Board meetings. There needs to be additional community involvement at those meetings.
- > Dr. Johnson provided copies of the budget to the co-chairs.
- > He informed the group that there is \$4648 in School Recognition, \$34,891 in Accountability funds. This budget is generated by the Business Support Center.
- > Mr. Spence shared that there were monies that weren't used by teachers (LEAD money each teacher receives) that were put back into the budget. This reflects an increase from last time the budget was reviewed.
- > Ms. Robinson shared a concern from teachers concerning issues w/ air conditioning and mold in the main building, and issues w/ water in the 800 building.
- > Mr. Spence informed the group that there are plans from the county for working on those issues.
- > Dr. Johnson asked the group that if people go to the School Board meetings, that they have all of the details. There are issues w/ funding that are still being worked out.
- > Ms. Fields shared that one of the main purposes of going to the School Board meetings is that our issues are a matter of public record.
- > Dr. Johnson told the group that we aren't receiving the amount of Security funding that we received years ago, due to the process (FTE allocated funds). Also, due to School Choice, we have over 1800 students who are designated to go here due to boundaries. We do have many students coming from out of boundary as part of the Magnet programs.
- > School Choice is having an effect on certain schools.
- > Ms. Robinson expressed a concern that we're not pressing issues that we need to, i.e. the patio area. Dr. Johnson shared that there are some issues that aren't visible (sprinkler system that

would cost much more than expected) that are being focused on. There are also issues that are more visible that need more focus, such as STEM labs and the patio area.

- > He also shared how much costs have gone up, due to the when construction is done, unexpected issues come up, such as extra piping being needed to be done. This creates additional issues.
- > The target date for the patio being done is next Thanksgiving.
- > The next Facilities meeting will be this Thursday. People are invited to come.
- > Ms. Blands brought up using the vending machine funds for extended learning opportunities for students. Dr. Johnson said that we can use SAC funds for these purposes. The wording has to be acceptable for this.
- > She also asked about the procedure on IDs. There is a district-wide issue w/ having students having them visible. Mr. Spence shared that administration is working w/ the teachers to ensure that students are coming to classes w/ IDs.
- > Right now there is no actual rule on this issue. There will be more clarification and consequences when the discipline matrix is revised for next year.

The next meeting will be held on January 15th in the Amphitheater.

Meeting Adjournment:

Motion: Betty Walker motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:50. Ms. Ford seconded. The motion carried unanimously with an Aye.


