


# SAC MINUTES

# **SAC Committee Meeting Minutes**

Monday, August 27, 2018 - 6:00 p.m.



- Chairperson McNabb presented a motion to move to accept the minutes from the May 2018
- Parent made the motion to accept the minutes from the May 2018 meeting.
- The installation of new SAC Committee members was moved to tonight's meeting.
  - The motion was made by a parent, and accepted.
- Motion was made to approve the 2018-2019 SAC bylaws.
- Ms. McNabb presented to the members Mrs. Leona Sturrup, nominee for new SAC Committee Chairperson.
  - The motion was made, and carried. There were no opposing votes.
- Ms. McNabb presented to the members Mr. Brandon Forbes as secretary for the 2018-2019 school year, contingent upon upcoming voting to occur on September 6th, by SAC Committee members.

#### Principal's Report

- Mr. Howard greeted the members.
- Addressed the committee about how to further school engagement (i.e. parent nights, parents of seniors, etc.). He stressed the importance of getting involved in school.
  - Voting urged parents to participate in voting tomorrow, August 28, 2018. He proposed the  $\frac{1}{2}$  mill law (bill to provide supplemental raises for educators in Broward County). He expressed the concern and need for "Securing the Next Generation," which this bill would achieve by allocating more funds for teachers.
  - Hallandale High School's Vision Mr. Howard presented the committee with the strides that are required to make education here accessible and applicable; how students are being equipped with resources in the classroom, and encouraged to apply those skills in real life scenarios.
  - Security Measures the "New Normal"
    - The perimeter gates Mr. Howard expressed the challenges that arise with the new security measures that have been implemented; i.e. having to lock the front and back gates, and closely monitoring those vehicles that enter and exit the premises.
    - ID Badges Mr. Howard encouraged parents to ensure that their students are wearing their ID badges every day.
    - O A parent raised concerns about the new security measures. Parent's concern was regarding if there would be designated personnel to monitor the gate prior to 6:45 a.m.
    - Mr. Howard opened the floor for questions:

Parent commended Mr. Howard and staff for May 2018 Graduation.

## School Improvement Plan Results

- Mrs. Sherman, Assistant Principal, disseminated the 2018-2019 School Improvement Plan.
  - Literacy Plan making sure that PLC's incorporated data analysis, teacher coaching, pushed SAT/ACT Testing, formal and informal assessments, pushed the Personalization (Study Hall) period through utilization of a variety of mediums.
  - English Department (FSA Scores) rose 7%.
  - Mrs. Sherman opened the floor for questions.

# Introduction of 2018-2019 SAC Committee Chairperson

Mrs. Sturrup introduced herself to the committee, including highlighting her 30 years of experience as an educator and within former SAC Committees. She then took direction of the remainder of the meeting.

### **Department Reports**

- Social Studies Ms. White expressed that students are being encouraged to vote. Students are currently being registered to vote within the department.
- English Language Arts Ms. I expressed that the department has started the year with data analysis; making sure that students identified their academic progress. She also expressed that the department has brought in assistance from the district. The district representatives will come to focus on Integration of Knowledge, which is a weak and current target area for instruction across all content areas.
  - Student Data Tracking the students meet with their teachers every Professional Study Day to discuss their performance on Mini-Assessments.
  - After school tutoring begins on September 6th, 2018. Ms. I urged committee members (parents) to take advantage of our after school tutoring program. This program consists of tutoring for core subjects, free transportation, as well as dinner.
    - Parent asked if SAT/ACT services will be provided for students. Ms. I expressed that the school will use Khan Academy to focus on the
  - CTACE Ms. Notkin expressed that students in their program are being encouraged to take the skills they have learned and apply them to real life applications.
  - JROTC Coach Carter informed parents that the PE uniforms will be shipped to the school. Students can also use the JROTC uniforms in the PE classes, as they are the same colors.
    - Coach Carter urged parents to encourage their students to take advantage of the chorus and band classes they are currently involved in.

## Closing Questions/Announcements

- Mrs. Sherman discussed First Day packets, which consist of the online link to the Student Parent asked about purchasing PE uniforms. Code of Conduct Parent acknowledgment form.
- Mrs. Mason, Drama teacher, made an announcement about upcoming production In the Heights. She is encouraging parents to get involved, as well as, to get the community involved.
  - Tickets are \$5 (both pre-sale tickets, and tickets being sold at the door).
  - The dates for the show are Thursday, September 27th and Friday, September 28th.
  - Mr. Howard asked parents to understand the benefit of utilizing Khan Academy and Navience.

- He expressed to students that the incoming freshman students (Class of 2023) will be unable to take the PERT test to fulfill high school graduation requirements. This is why he is suggesting that the students gain the benefit of using programs like Khan Academy, SAT/ACT prep, and their Study Hall period.
- Open House is scheduled for September 18th, 2018.
- Mr. Howard closed with thanking the parents for selecting Hallandale High School as their child's choice for their high school journey. He expressed the desire for partnership and collaboration between parents and school, to continue assessing our school.
- o A STEM Magnet student posed the concern of the time that is required to hire a new Engineering teacher for the STEM Program, in which he is currently a part of. Mr. Howard assured the student that he is diligently seeking out the right, qualified candidate for our school.
  - Parent questioned how this void with the teacher vacancy will affect students.
- o Mrs. Sturrup reassured parents that Hallandale High School is a student-friendly institution that prides itself on putting the care of students first. She encouraged parents to be active in our school's endeavors.
- o Next SAC Meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 24th at 6:00 p.m.
- o Mr. Howard motioned to adjourn at 7:02 p.m.
