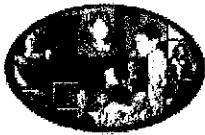

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SAC MEETING MINUTES

Hallandale High School

SAC Committee Meeting Minutes
Monday, September 24, 2018 – 6:00 p.m.



- Mrs. Leona Sturrup called the SAC Meeting to order at 6:18 pm.
 - She thanked Ms. Mason and the Drama Club for previewing a scene from their upcoming *In The Heights* Production.
- **Principal's Report**
 - Mr. Howard commended Ms. Mason and the Drama Club students for their preview.
 - He stressed the importance of attendance within our 21st Century afterschool program, other after school programs and organizations.
 - He discussed the upcoming Field Trip for the 5000 Role Models of Excellence Program, where the young men will be participating in Former First Lady Michelle Obama's "Get up and Vote" forum.
 - **SMART Renovations**
 - Mr. Howard expressed to the members that blueprints are underway to renovate Hallandale High School's Media Center. He wants a modern approach, while maintaining the traditional Hallandale standard.
 - There will be renovations done to four science classrooms, to give the rooms a more modern educational experience.
 - There will be renovations to the Engineering classrooms.
 - The weight room has been fully renovated.
 - There will be a muralist who will be called upon to gift our school with artwork to promote school spirit and CHARGER Pride.
 - **Low Enrollment**
 - Enrollment numbers across the district, specifically 6 high schools in our zone (including HHS), have lost about one hundred students. He expressed that we did not meet our expectations for enrollment by about 110 students.
 - Mr. Howard expressed that due to Hallandale's low enrollment and funding, there were five teachers who were released from employment.
 - There will be immediate changes made to the master schedule, where teachers will be asked to take on extra classes.
 - Mr. Howard explained that this low enrollment is a result of a variety of elements, including the transient student population, charter schools, students leaving to attend other schools, etc.
 - Parent raised the question about what Hallandale's vision is for its future, and addressing these enrollment issues. Mr. Howard believes that our groundbreaking blueprints will cultivate community interest.
 - Parent raised the question of which departments were affected by the five teachers being released. Mr. Howard responded that the school had to release teachers from core subject areas.
 - Current enrollment is 1249.

- SGA Officer, Rachel, inquired what students could do to encourage each other as a body to stay at Hallandale? Mr. Howard expressed that it is important to work on the “product” – that is, student involvement, school pride, community support, staple programs, events, etc. He assured that he and the Administration and faculty are working diligently to produce innovative ideas that allows students to feel ownership of and pride within their school.

- **Student Engagement**

- Mrs. Sturup posed the question to the SGA Officer, what exactly makes her want to be here at Hallandale? The student responded that she was drawn to Hallandale because of the different clubs/organizations that Hallandale offers. She attributes her CHARGER Pride to the idea that she believes that students here at Hallandale have a voice; she suggests that Hallandale is a family.
 - Rachel suggested that Student Government Association can be the platform that can evoke great changes here at the school.
 - Student asked what steps can be taken to begin clubs/organizations here at Hallandale.
 - Mr. Howard expressed that the school is in the process of bringing the SPIDER Program.
- Mrs. Sturup thanked Mr. Howard for his report.

- **Department Reports**

- Mrs. Sherman highlighted our great Magnet Program and its various accomplishments. She expressed that our CTACE Program is second in the county. She expressed to the committee that one of the primary concerns for our Magnet Program is exposure.
 - Taking our students and programs over to the Middle Schools in the community.
- **Social Studies** – Ms. White reported that Social Studies covered “Constitution Day” (September 17) as a department and with students, which is a mandate by the district. Other focal points:
 - Hispanic Heritage Month
 - LGBT Awareness
 - Enrichment Day – for students who passed their respective EOC exams; there were over 170 students who passed the exam.
- **Literacy Across the Curriculum**
 - Constantly monitoring the schoolwide literacy plan.
 - SAT “Word of the Day”
 - There will be friendly competition activities scheduled for next month using words.
 - Write Score
 - 9th and 10th Grade ELA students will be taking two mock FSA Writing Assessments (November 2018 and February 2019)
 - Fair Testing
 - “Pull Outs” – students will be pulled out and targeted with strategies and resources that will assist them in passing the FSA or ACT/SAT. These students are considered “bubble kids” – students who are in close proximity of a passing score.
 - Khan Academy will be incorporated twice a week through our Hope Program.

- LEAP Program After school tutoring; Ms. Harris is urging parents to encourage student attendance.
- The PSAT will be given in October.
 - Mr. Howard expressed to the committee that the PSAT is the assessment that puts students on the college radar.
- **New Business**
 - Mrs. Sherman introduced a partnership company for teacher retirement plans, parent retirement plans, and student and parent savings. This company promotes assisting and educating parents with their credit.
 - Great benefits: discounts on shopping, traveling, dental insurance, auto insurance, life – lock (anti-theft with stolen identity).
- **Comments/Suggestions**
 - Parent and Former PTSA President, and current Broward County PTSA Council President, is encouraging students, faculty, and parents to join PTSA. She mentioned an upcoming event at the Samuel Delevoe Park on October 6th that will highlight the issue of human trafficking.
 - Parent also suggested that SGA Member (Rachel) become a member of the PTSA Council.
- **Closing**
 - Mrs. Sturup thanked everyone for a quiet, yet informative meeting.
 - Mr. Howard made a motion to adjourn. The motion was carried by parent.
- Meeting adjourned at 7:18 p.m.
