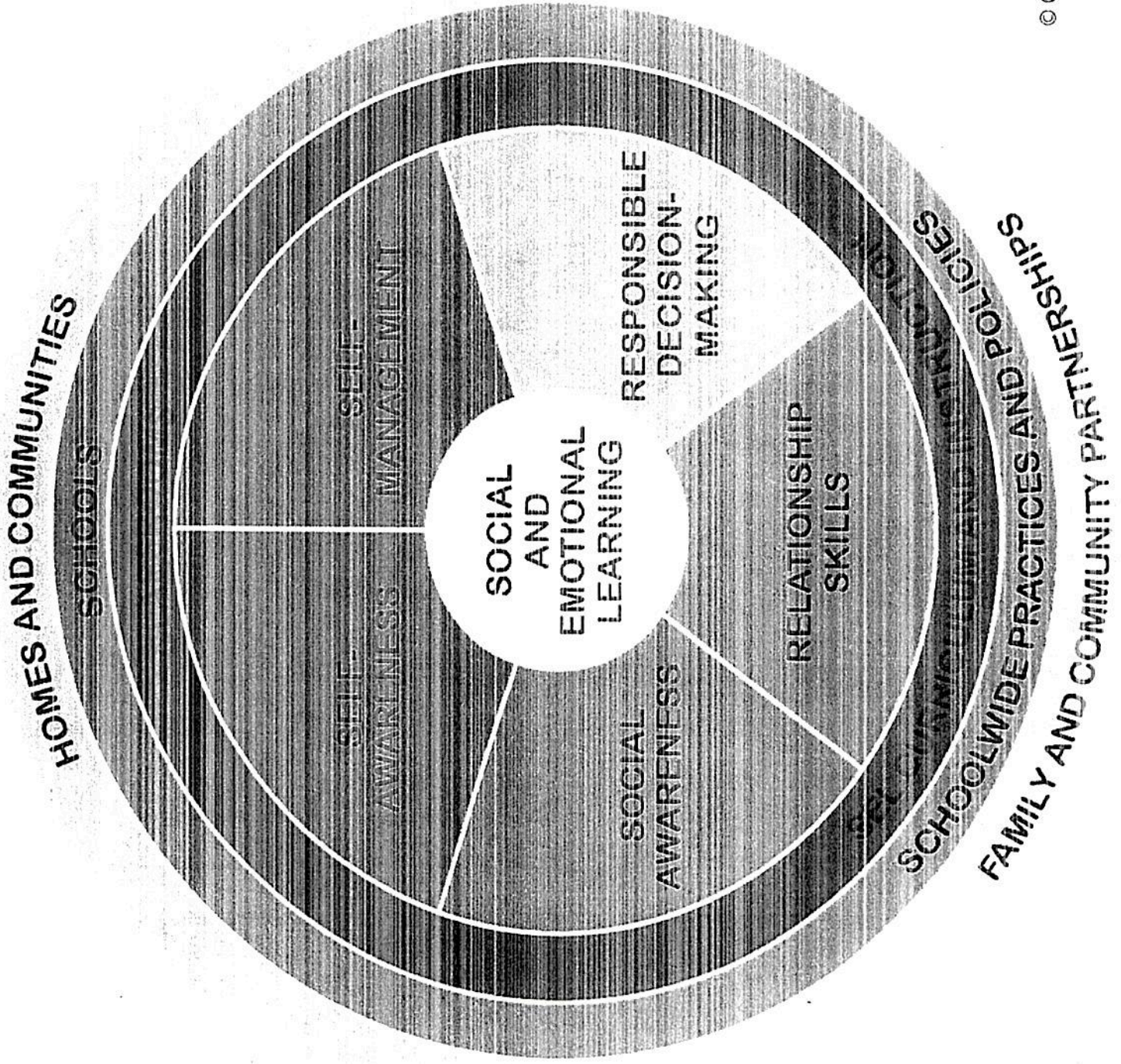
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SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) COMPETENCIES

SELF-MANAGEMENT

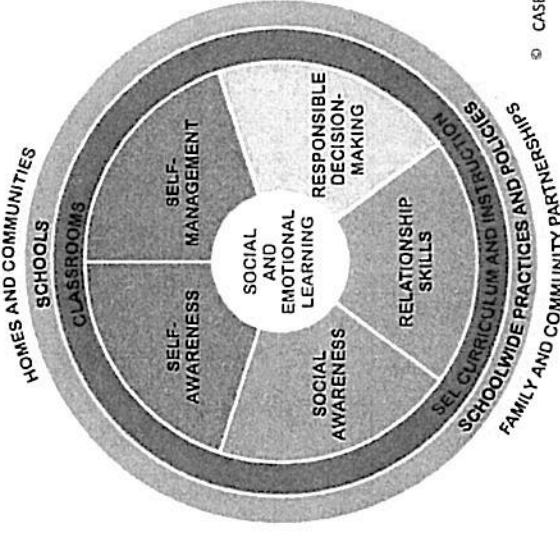
