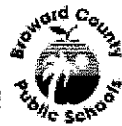

What is "No Child Left Behind"?

Education act signed into law in 2002 that aims to:

- Ensure that every student has a high-quality education
- Challenge and motivate students
- Provide highly qualified teachers, who use proven teaching methods
- Ensure a safe, drug free learning environment

So Broadview is a Title 1 school; what is Title I anyways?

- Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools designed to increase academic achievement
- The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
- The Dept. of Education distributes Title 1 funds to schools based on the number of low-income students (those eligible for free/reduced lunch) and then those who have an academic need

How Title I Works

- The federal government provides funding to states, then the state (Fl. Dept. of Education) sends them to the district which disperses them to the eligible schools
- Broadview creates and implements a School Wide program. Funds can be used to upgrade the educational program in ways that may impact every student in the school

Parent's Rights

- Be involved and request regular meetings to expression your opinions, concerns and questions
- Be provided information on your child's level of achievement on assessments in reading/language arts, mathematics, and science;
- Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher
- Be informed if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks.

 - School safety and climate for learning information;
 - Academic data;
 - Class sizes;
 - Teacher and staff information;

Title I funds

- Broadview Elementary is provided \$328,460 to pay for services and programs for our students.
- Title I funds pay for the following:
 - \$306,104 for teacher/teacher assistants salaries
 - \$300 for National Urban League Conference for Principal or Assistant Principal
 - \$11,656 FSA Aligned Instructional Materials
 - \$3,480 ASCD Conference
 - \$1,000 Afterschool Clubs
 - \$12,000 Teacher Stipend for FSA Camp

Title I Programs Provide Supplemental Support

- Smaller classes;
- Additional teachers, paraprofessionals and other support (Reading Interventionist);
- Additional training for school staff;
- Extra time for instruction (Before and/or after school programs);
- Parental Involvement Activities;
- A variety of supplemental teaching methods and materials.

Who decides how funds are used?

- Every school has a School Advisory Council (SAC) composed of:
 - Parents, Teachers, Other staff that works at the school, and the Principal
- The School Advisory Council along with Mr. Lee determine how to use Accountability Funds.

 - Title I Plan (School Improvement Plan).




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Parent Involvement Plan Requirements


