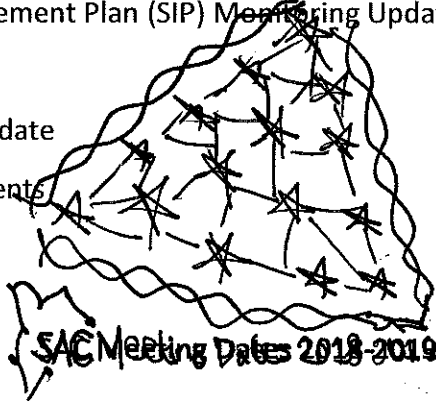

- I. Welcome, Call to Order & Introductions
 - a. Meeting called to order at 5:32pm
 - b. Introductions
- II. Approval of Minutes from 5/1/18 SAC Meeting
 - a. Motion to approve minutes by Amy Cadigan, Jayden Martin 2nd, all in favor, minutes approved
- III. Principal's Comments
 - a. Plantation went up 46 points this school year. CTACE scores are in. Will be able to better guestimate after AP and IB scores that come in December.
 - b. Landscaping done over the summer – over 100 people worked on painting, moving classrooms
 - c. Football streak – has won every game so far. Next week we play Miramar.
 - i. No bags unless it is a clear bag at the games.
 - d. Girl's volleyball and JV football won their first games.
 - e. Code red drill and two fire drills went through smooth. Parentlink to let them know they were happening before and after the drill.
 - f. 9 members on security team and gates are locked at all times. Students that have to leave campus at a certain time wear certain badges and are able to leave between 1:10 and 1:20 (senior privilege, dual enrollment). Gates are manned until 5pm every day. After that point, coaches need to escort and let students out of the gate. At 4pm there is a Plantation police officer that does detail for community school.
 - g. 21 students enrolled in Gifted Academy.
 - h. Activity bus M-Th – student services has all of the routes – buses leave at 5:15pm.
 - i. Open house September 11th. Sports and activity showcase from 5:30pm-6:00pm. Class schedule starts at 6:00pm, will run until about 8:00pm. You will have 10 minutes in each class and 5 minutes in between classes.
- IV. SAC Bylaw Ratification
 - a. Same as in previous years, except for under Article III, Section III – 1 year terms for election instead of 2 year terms.
 - b. Motion to approve the bylaws by Opal Ferron, 2nd Valentina Attah, all in favor, bylaws approved.
- V. SAC Membership Nominations/Voting
 - a. I-zone Rep – “innovations zone” consists of PHS, PMS, Central Park, Sawgrass Elementary. They have bimonthly meetings. A rep is required to attend.
 - b. SAF Designee – monthly basis meetings, rotating Morning/Evening, made up of school advisory forums throughout the district.
 - c. ESOL Rep – parent of a non-English speaking student.
 - d. Gifted Rep – Vallone nominates Cadigan as Gifted/ESE rep, Warren 2nd, all in favor, approved.
- VI. SAC Officer Nominations/Voting
 - a. Amend the bylaws to state October meeting for elections instead of September. Tracy Yudell made the motion to approve, Spohn 2nd, all in favor, approved.
 - b. SAC Chair – October.
 - c. SAC Secretary – October.

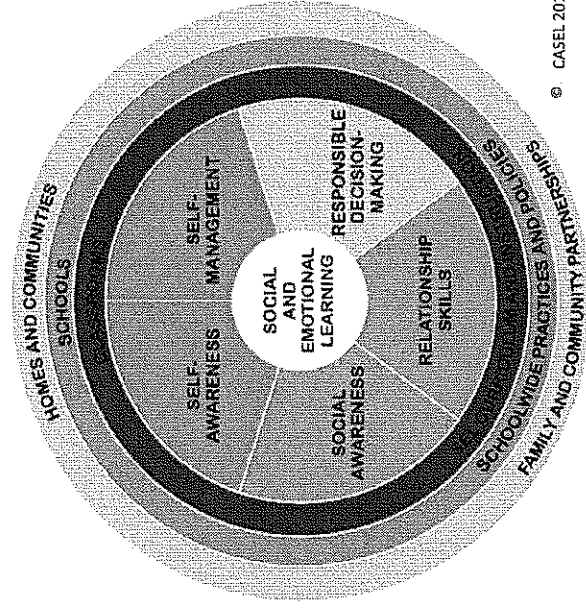

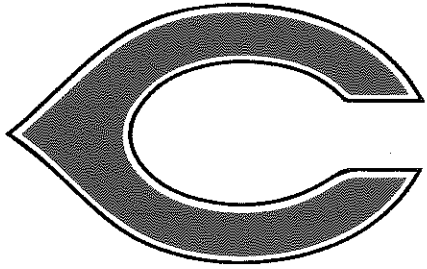
