- Title I- Parent Training Academy- February 28 7:00-8:30 at Horizon Elementary School- Growing Through STEM Explorations
- Title I Event- Black History month Performance, Parent Training, Book Fair starts at 6:15 in the cafeteria
- Bond Info- Teacher Small Group tables, computers for classrooms, front office remodel
- New Head Facilities- We are working to make changes about the looks and condition of the school. Mr. Garcia has been working to make great changes. We are encouraging scholars to pick up after them selves and work on the overall appearance of the school and classrooms.
- Safety & Security- Tuesday the district passed two policies in regards to safety.
 - Emergency Codes (2120)- Anyone in the school is able to call a code red if they suspect a problem
 - Emergency Drills are done monthly (including code reds)- These are to prepare the staff and scholars in case of an emergency
 - Safe Spaces (2150)- Every classroom should have a safer space within the classroom to ensure students have a safe space during a code red. This space is a designated space that is out of sight and provides protection for the students and teachers.
 - Policies can be found on browardschools.com (Safety and Security)
 - Parent Questions-
 - How often do you practice a code red?- Monthly
- Recognition for TOY- Mr. Jordan- He was nominated for TOY of Broward County
- Testing-
 - Testing Calendar is provided to parents for all grade levels
 - FSA 4th/5th- April 2nd
 - FSA 3rd- April 2nd & 3rd
 - May 1st & 2nd- ELA 4th-5th
 - May 3rd & 6th- Science 5th
 - May 7th & 8th- Math 3rd-5th
 - Make sure scholars are well rested and eat a healthy breakfast
 - We will have a review and calm morning so please make sure scholars are to school on time to eat breakfast
- Promotion Criteria- Policy 6000.1
 - Parents received a copy of the Promotion Criteria for their scholar's grade level
 - Promotion Criteria is NOT saying the child is on grade level. It is saying the child has enough to be moved on to the next grade level.
 - We strive for levels higher than listed on promotion criteria
 - 3rd Grade has very limited options outside of FSA
 - 3rd Grade is mandatory retention (except for Good Cause exceptions)
 - 3rd Grade does have summer school
 - Ms. Haynes spoke to parents of primary students about working with students at home to help them be successful as they get older. Have students read and discuss the book after it is read.
 - Interim Reports went home so check to see if NOT meeting promotion criteria was marked.

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- Reach out to your child's teacher to see how your child is doing
- School Grade Prediction-
 - Shared the school prediction chart with parents
 - Calculation of school grade was discussed with parents so they can see how learning gains and scores are calculated. Discussed growth (Learning gains) and proficiency
 - Predicted grade is a B – This will take a lot of hard work, but it is do-able. We can't accept just good enough- we need to push our scholars to reach high expectations.
 - As a parent we need to not accept low grades. We need our kids to always work hard and aim for 70% or higher. If they bring home lower grades than that and the parent they can redo their work and do extra practice.
