## Principal Update:

- Mr. Correll asked how we can get more people to come to the SAC meeting.

### Dr. Leydig

Presented the School Wide Positive Behavior Plan (PBIS): It includes:

- Behavior data (Top 5 Behavior Incidents)
- School Wide expectations
- CARE Control my Behavior, Act Responsibly, Respect Others, Engage Learning
- Top 3 Locations Hallway, Cafeteria, and School Grounds
- Discussion of rules and expectations
- Discipline Flow chart teachers have to know which behavior warrants a refferral
- Office Managed behaviors and Teacher Managed Behaviors
- We are aiming to become CHAMPS school
- 60% referrals are from the classroom

- 90% of students have 1 or less referrals
- 2 to 5 referrals <15%</li>
- More than 5 referrals < 5%</li>
- Posters, lesson plans, Flowcharts to be given to teachers, and we use the Penguin Bucks.
