 - a. Called to order per Mr. Philphart
- II. Review and Acceptance of Previous Minutes
 - a. Initial Approval – Ms. Soffer
 - b. Second Approval – Ms. Jackson
- III. Principals Report – Mr. Marlow –
 - a. Report to the city – quarterly for the principals.
 - b. Ms. Delance is running college tour for students having a 2.5-2.7 gpa , SAT, ACT. The program has been going on for nine years. Currently functioning through the Urban league. Extended for another three years. 75 kids. Oct 13 kick off.
 - c. Ms. Delance over Upward Bound through BC. Targeting students with 2.5gpa below and prepping them for college. Scheduling some college tours and prepping the students for the postsecondary process.
 - d. Take stock in children – Ms. Eade – 28 kids enrolled. Providing two scholarships – four years to distinct colleges and university. Assists with college process and all students are given person a mentor so students stay on track. Candidates are chosen at the middle school level. Q/A: Mentors choose the school that they would work at.
 - e. Mentoring for Tomorrows Leaders – Mr. Taylor - 175 students registered in the program. Past - One of two schools to receive 100k grant a peace. Future - Now it was divided between multiple schools. Funds were spent on blazers, sweaters, etc. Focused on young black males but now accepting young females.
 - f. College Readiness - 80% seniors have college readiness credentials. 430k to go to the school. Every department assists with the industry service program – assisting to be successful. We were number 3 with close to 90% of students - college ready.
 - g. Athletics – Coach Tozzi “We are doing great”

 - ii. DBHS pool has been refurbished.
 - h. Student entrepreneurship – six week camp for business startup. 1 student out of 5 to fly to NY and complete for 5-10k. Diane Gellin came in second place. Her product was Waffle-on-a-Stick for \$5.
