Call to Order:

A meeting of the Boyd H. Anderson High School Advisory Council was held in Room 161 on January 15, 2019.

Madame Chair Melissa Yezdimir\_called the meeting to order at 5:31pm . Aaron Valle recorded minutes for this meeting.

#### Reports

#### Principals Report: 5:32pm

- The state released the official graduation rate and ours is projected to be 94.3%. Thanks to the hard work of our faculty and administration we continue to have a high graduation rate.
- Dr. Thomas, the Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders director had a successful evening with 105 students present.
   There were tables in a formal setting, food, and celebration. Dr. Osgood was present during the evening and everyone looked their best.
- The aviation program has a group of tenth graders who are taking a dual enrollment program through Embry Riddle. We hired a pilot who comes to school to teach this class. She comes every other day, in full uniform, and we are currently looking to purchase a flight simulation program to use in that class. There is a field trip being planned with the pilot to visit a private or regional airport so that the students can be immersed in the subject matter.
- Ms. Ford has been engaged with district personnel regarding a math project that is now in session in two
  schools: Coconut Creek and Hallandale. The schools and students like the program and we have volunteered
  to be a part of it. This is a math program that allows teachers to communicate and attend professional
  development throughout the year to better their practice.
- There are engineering marks in the front of the school indicating where the single point of entry fence will be installed. We are in the final stages of this process and it should be completed soon. Safety and security are a priority in our school: everyone is checked upon entry to the campus and IDs are scanned before anyone enters the school.
- We are continuing college tours through the YMCA. These tours are important for our students; by attending they can see themselves in a different environment and spur their desire for continued education.

Graduation Requirements with Ms. Andrade 5:51pm

- Ms. Andrade reviewed the state requirements.
- Core courses are not remediated; students need to earn the credits necessary to graduate.

- Some classes can count for multiple credits. Two years of JROTC, as an example, will give students credits in Performing Arts, PE, and Electives.
- There is an 18 credit diploma available to students to graduate early or for certain circumstances.
- Attendance is key to student success. The school board motto is "Attendance Counts" and missing school amounts to much more than low grades. Depending on the student excessive tardies or absences can lead to punitive measures such as Driver's License suspension.

- Began with overview of courses offered.
- 3 total credits required for graduation.
- End of Course practice through USA test prep. Success rate for this test has risen in the last two years from 32% to 49% due to the diligence of the Social Studies department.
