## Reports

### Principals Report: 5:33pm

- We are focused on graduation. There are some seniors who have yet to meet their testing requirements. We continue to work with these students to pass one of the tests within the four opportunities left in the year. If the students complete their requirements, even this summer, they still graduate this year.
- We are scheduling students for classes this year, so please be involved with your children to help guide them to the classes they need. It is important that you know what the students need to take, and are currently scheduled to take next year, so that you can plan to be successful.
- Super testing days are May 6, 7, 13, and 14. On those four days students will go home at 11:40am. We will do a parent link to inform families that on those days students will be completing their FSA and EOC testing.
- The trip to California was a huge success. They had a full agenda and were able to do many educational activities along with recreational activities. Ms. Duperval is already putting together a trip for 2021 to Europe.
- Last year we had our career fair and it was a great success. We had 25 alumni and local business people who met with students here in room 161, in the gym, and in classrooms. There was such a variety of different employers and business people that it opened the eyes of many students to the possibilities that lie before them. There are so many professions out there that our students don't know about that. Exposing them as often as we can to these professions will increase their options after high school.
- There is a summer reading list, (handout present during meeting) please share them with the students. If they complete these assignments, the English department is offering extra credit for the new school year so that students can come to school already with a strong grade.

CTACE department with Ms. Redman 5:46pm

- Presented the overview of the CTACE department whose main goal is to have students leave with industry certifications that students can use nationally.
- Health and Wellness covers all medical fields and offers certifications for: EMR, EKG, and CMAA with a 90% pass rate. This year 32 of 34 students passed the EMR test.

- Business Technology offers classes in digital design, publishing, coding, web design, web development with industry certifications in InDesign, Illustrator, Dreamweaver, and Microsoft Office.
- Culinary offers food and beverage safety and restaurant management courses. The industry certifications offered are ServSafe and ProStart with an 80% pass rate this year.
- Aerospace is our aviation program partnered with Embry Riddle for a dual enrollment class. This offers the Remote Pilot industry certification along with college credit for a class taught by a pilot from Embry Riddle.

- The scheduling process for students entails students sitting with a counselor one on one while looking at the student's academic history.
- We offer credit recovery and classes over the summer. Credit recovery is for students missing credits while grade forgiveness is for students who had a D and would like to increase their GPA. Summer school offers Breakfast, Lunch, and transportation but students can also stay home and take classes via FLVS.
- Naviance is a program the counselors promote as it provides students all the information they need for their future. Take time and go into Naviance with your children to see scholarships and information about colleges and universities.
