Title 1 Liaison-

Monthly Newsletter was passed out during the October Meeting to discuss the activities and events that will be taking place at Cypress. Every month we encourage parents to come out and support the events. Phone calls will be made to encourage parents to be a part of the community and events.

## Principal's Report-

- We are a Title 1 school. We provide a variety of events to share with parents what the students are working on in school and work with parents on ho they can support their child at home. Ms. Schnur encouraged parents to come out to the school and learn along with us.
- Cypress is working on what students will need to be successful on FSA. Data is used to
  drive instruction. Data chats are meetings with teachers to discuss how to improve
  instruction and works towards becoming an "A" school.
- There are 7 categories that are accounted for the school grade. ELA, ELA LG, ELA Low25 LG, MATH, MATH LG, MATH Low25 LG and Science. Ms. Schnur explained each category.

The goal at Cypress is to show points of growth in each area to improve on the FSA assessment: ELA, Math, and Science. It is important that each child makes growth from year to year.

- Saturday camp, After-School, and Language Enrichment camps are offered to students for additional support in academics. Instructional Coaches and teachers pull small groups and work with students that need additional assistance in ELA or Math.
- Teachers work with grade-level peers to plan instruction (group activities, thematic units, center activities, lesson plans.)
- Vertical Teams- Pre-k to 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers discuss math, reading and science strategies.
- Construction update- Electrical pipes, roof, A/C units, painting, carpet and funds are being generated to replace furniture and to give back to school community. Teachers are moving out of their classrooms due to a few updates made inside the rooms.
- Zone meeting- Ely/Pompano- parents have the opportunity to meet the principals.
   October 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:30. Parents may ask the principal questions in-regards to academics.
- Funds request for yearbook sales \$2,443- Needs approval to pay invoices from past sales in order to continue purchasing yearbooks in advance for sale for the upcoming year.
   SAC committee approves the use of the funds to pay invoices for future yearbooks sales.
   Committee members that approve: M. Aversa, D. Brennen, S. Figuora, B. Folks, A.
   Gadson, E. Greene, K. Jones, E. Kane, B. Knight, V. Schnur, and A. Tokan all approve of this vote.
- School events- Chuckie Cheese, Red-Ribbon Week (Say No to Drugs), Read for the Record, and Transformer Kids Project- assists the elderly with electronics.
