Minutes

- Welcome Amy Oppy and Stacey Arbogast welcomed everyone to the SAC meeting.
- Review of Minutes Ms. Luckenbach motioned to approve the minutes as written, Ms. Puia seconded the meeting. The minutes were approved as written.
- 3. Membership (SAC Composition) Ms. Rogers and Ms. Blake were voted by the committee to become members of the SAC committee. Ms. Luckenbach explained the requirements of the SAC composition.
- 4. <u>Title One Representatives Ms. Luckenbach introduced Ms. Rogers as our Title One representative for AWE.</u> She will represent AWE at title one meetings. She will also attend the parent seminar on February 2nd at the Signature Grand. Ms. Luckenbach asked if there were any other parents interested in being a Title One representative. Ms. Luckenbach reminded parents about the upcoming Title One meeting, Planting Seeds of Learning, at Atlantic West Elementary on October 25th.

- SIP: Title 1 Addendum, etc. Ms. Arbogast shared our goals for the 2017-2018 school year and our test results. The goals will be reviewed and strategies to increase.
 - a. <u>Parent Involvement</u> Increase; Agendas are used as a resource;
 Family curriculum nights and a FSA parent night for 2nd 5th grade are planned for this year.
 - b. 20<u>18-2019 goals</u> Ms. Oppy explained the progress of writing SIP goals for the new school year.
 - c. <u>Behavior Plan</u> Ms. Lewis explained our schoolwide behavior plan based on our SOAR expectations (Self Control, On Task, Acceptance and Respect). The rules throughout the school (cafeteria, classroom, hallway, playground) are based on these SOAR expectations. The students receive incentives (SOAR student of the week, SOAR tickets) for displaying the SOAR behavior. Teachers follow specific steps before writing a discipline referral. Some behaviors are handled in the classroom, such as calling out and other behaviors are handled by administration, such as a physical fight.
 - d. Ms. Oppy explained the RTI process,
 - e. <u>School goals</u> Ms. Oppy explained that our ELA scores from 2018 were: 34%, math 46% and science36%. Best Practices standards

mastery tests and extra iReady lessons, K-3 struggling readers use
Leveled Literacy Intervention, the lowest 30% in ELA are pulled by
Ms. Rivera Whaley for intervention and the lowest 30% in math are
pulled by Ms. Brocale for intervention. We will monitor the progress
of our students through data chats with teachers and administration.
Also, struggling students are monitored through the RTI process.
Grade level teams are participating in Professional Learning
Communities to monitor the students progress and discuss
instructional strategies. Ms. Oppy asked for parent input and
suggestions for the SIP.

6. School Choice Update – Ms. Eagan explained the status of the school choice purchases. Ms. Eagan put the PE shade on hold in order to research additional safety upgrades. We will be getting additional security cameras around our campus from the district. The district hired a safety consultant called Safe Haven. They will be writing a report about the needs of all the schools. Ms. Eagan asked if we should go ahead and purchase the shade or pay for additional safety upgrades. Ms. Rogers, a parent, said we should purchase the shade. Ms. Dittmeier also agreed that the campus is secure and we should purchase a shade. Ms. Precious, CAS, agreed that the shade would be beneficial. Ms. Eagan also explained that we are hiring a part time

- campus monitor for the gates. Ms. Dittmeier motioned to purchase the shade, Ms. Precious seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- 7. Principal's Report Ms. Brocale is back this school year to support our intermediate math students. We are also looking to hire for a speech therapist, campus monitor and a pool substitute. All of the 3-5 grade teachers and support staff are attending small guided reading group training. Our new cadre director, Mr. King, will visit our campus on Monday, October 22nd.
- 8. <u>Concerns/Celebrations</u> Clubs will start October 29th. Letters have been sent home with our students. We are still looking for some club monitors. Ms. Beisch celebrated Mr. Cole, he has started a legacy club for some male students in the school. Coco, the therapy dog, visits Atlantic West every Friday from 9:00 1:00. PTA had a great turn out for the book fair!

 <u>Ms.</u> Dittmeier motioned to adjourn the meeting, Ms. Precious seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 3:24 pm.
