Call to order	Ms. Emrith calls the meeting to order at 5:05, Dr. Givens seconds. All in favor.
Approval of October Minutes	Ms. Bell moves that we accept the minutes as written. Dr. Givens seconds. All in favor.
Principal's Report	ID badges have arrived, students are now wearing them as part of unified dress. First quarter dance went very well, it was sponsored by the Athletic department. We have hired another campus monitor and are in the process of hiring another. We will have a Bair Homecoming this year at a home Basketball game, there will be shirts for sale, the first 300 shirts sold is their entrance into the game. A college tour will be open to MTL and 8 th grade students next year. The activities committee will be working on some more activities for next year.
A+ Funds	The school was awarded \$81,000. There will be two meetings on November 8 th , one in the morning and one in the afternoon so all parties can come and have their voice heard on how the money should be distributed. A sub committee will be formed from the meetings, where they will create three proposals which will be approved at SAC, then faculty will vote. One recommendation must be "none of the above." The deadline is February 1 st . The sub committee will be comprised of members of SAC as well as the school community (teachers, custodians, clerical, cafeteria, etc). Ms. Harris comes with years of experience as she has been part of the BCPS and the BAIR Middle Family for some years now.</p> <p>Social Studies (Schaeffer) – The Social Studies department also welcomes Ms. Harris to our team, we are very excited to have her. 6th Grade is working on Ancient Egypt right now, 7th grade is finishing up the Constitution and moving into the Declaration of Independence, and 8th Grade is working on unrest in the colonies moving into the American Revolution.</p> <p>Math – 6th grade is working on fraction and decimal operations, 7th grade is working on percents and 8th grade is working on functions. Algebra 1 is moving into linear functions, and geometry is moving into gridding triangles.</p>
